Purpose: To develop a functional knowledge of the piano and its role in the

study of music. The course has been structured so as to help a student develop technical skills on the piano while reinforcing theoretical concepts presented concurrently in other areas of the Musicianship sequence. Emphasis throughout the two-year sequence will be placed on playing scales, chords, cadences, and

other theoretical patterns in various keys, sight reading,

improvising, harmonizing and transposing at the piano, as well as

performing selected repertoire.
