**FURMAN-WOFFORD  
SERIES INFORMATION  
(Furman leads 70-33)**

Monday's game between Furman and Wofford will mark the 104th meeting between the Paladins and Terriers in a series that got its start with a 30-10 Furman win in Greenville during the 1908-09 season. Furman leads the series 70-33, but Wofford has won the last three meetings, including both clashes a year ago when the Terriers topped the Paladins 90-83 in overtime in Greenville and later bested Furman in Spartanburg by a 69-57 score. Furman registered its last win over Wofford two years ago, edging the Terriers 70-61 in Greenville. Overall the Paladins sport a 43-13 record versus Wofford in Greenville. In Spartanburg the Paladins have compiled a 27-18 record against the Terriers. In two games whose sites have been temporarily lost to history, Wofford is 2-0 against Furman.

**NOTING THE PALADINS**

**PALADIN POINTERS**...Furman heads into Monday's Southern Conference clash against Wofford saddled with a six-game losing streak that extends back to Dec. 23 when the Paladins' dropped a 71-56 decision to Minnesota. In falling 72-63 to Chattanooga on Saturday, the Paladins dropped their 11th straight road games and 19th consecutive decision to the Mocs in Chattanooga, where Furman's last victory came during the 1979-80 season. Furman's last seven game losing streak came in the final four games of the 1997-97 season and first three games of the 1997-98 campaign. Wofford comes into Monday night's game having claimed three wins in its last four outings, including an 82-66 victory over Georgia Southern in Spartanburg on Saturday. Monday's contest will mark the Terriers' first road conference game of the season. In contrast, three of Furman's four league games thus far have been road contests. Senior forward Stanislav Makshantsev, Furman's leading returning scorer (14.5 ppg) and rebounder (6.5 rpg) from a year ago, is scheduled to see his first action of the 1999-00 campaign on Monday against Wofford. Makshantsev, who regained his athletic eligibility on Dec. 15, served an eight-game suspension beginning on Dec. 15 for violation of team rules. Furman is getting 87.0% of its scoring and 83.2% of its rebounding from its freshman and sophomore classes heading into the Wofford game. After averaging 18.3 turnovers/game a year ago, Furman has notched significant improvement in its ballhandling this year as evidenced by the 15.1 turnovers/game the Paladins has committed through 18 games. Furman's top two point guards, freshman Guilherme Da Luz and sophomore Paul Foster, have combined to tally 122 assists against 90 turnovers (+1.35 assist/turnover ratio). Though not an outstanding figure, it speaks of noteworthy improvement when compared to the +0.86 assist/turnover ratio (104 assists/120 turnovers) registered by the Paladins' top two point guards a year ago. Da Luz's play this season includes a school single game record 14 assists he tallied in the Paladins' 97-75 win over Coastal Carolina (Dec. 16) and a team leading 34 steals through 18 games. In Saturday's loss to Chattanooga, Da Luz scored a season high 26 points, including 23 in the second half, to eclipse his previous high of 23, which he registered in the Paladins' 75-68 loss to South Carolina (Dec. 4). After missing last Monday's Davidson game and virtually the entire week of practice, sophomore guard Kyle Julius suffered through one of the worst games of his career in Saturday's loss to Chattanooga, going 0x9 from the field and 0x7 from 3-point range in 16 minutes. While Julius has struggled from 3-point range this year, he has registered marked improvement at the free throw line, going from 65.8% as a freshman to his current 83.8% (31x37). Furman posted its worst half of shooting in school history in the loss to UTC, converting only 5x32 FGs (15.6%) in the first period en route to a 37-16 halftime deficit. Furman has knocked down 72.9% of its free throws (145x199) over the past nine contests, but the Paladins have found the mark on only 40x163 3-point attempts (24.5%) over the past 10 games. Named Southern Conference Player-of-the-Week on Dec. 21 after averaging 22.5 ppg and 9.0 rpg in a pair of Paladins victories, freshman forward Karim Souchu ranks among league leaders in scoring (16.3 ppg) and rebounding (8.1 rpg). Freshman guard Willie Brown will be redshirted for the 1999-00 season. Furman will honor its 1999 Southern Conference championship football team and individual award winners at halftime of Monday's game against Wofford.
