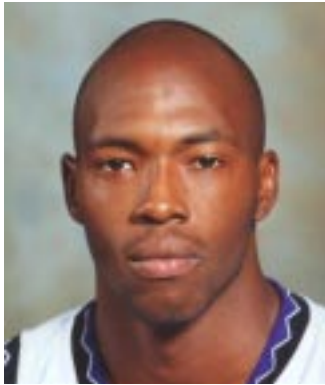

GENERAL: Ranks alongside fellow senior Marcus Dilligard as one of Furman's most experienced and respected players...expected to provide quality backup play at the wing guard slot...excels as a defender and is a strong leader who boasts an excellent understanding of the program's offensive and defensive philosophies...will serve as a team captain this year...possesses impressive physical strength and good overall quickness...sports a notable work ethic and intensity...followed Marcus Dilligard as the second signee of head coach Larry Davis, joining the program prior to the start of the 1997-98 school year.

AS A JUNIOR (1999-00): Appeared in 30 games as a backup wing guard and averaged 1.4 ppg...played a season high 18 minutes and scored a season high eight points while collecting four rebounds in the Paladins' season opening 125-53 win over Southeastern in Greenville...tallied six points and a pair of boards in a 67-60 win over Chattanooga in Greenville...had four assists in a 76-59 win over Oglethrope in Greenville...contributed six points and pair of rebounds in a 67-60 win over Chattanooga in Greenville.

AS A SOPHOMORE (1998-99): Saw action in 27 games and earned starts in three contests at second guard for an injured Bubba Smith...starts came against Winthrop (60-59 loss), Georgia Southern in Statesboro (60-57 loss), and College of Charleston in Greenville (81-68 loss)...scored a season high nine points against Georgia Southern in Statesboro...tallied five points, including a key 3-pointer to help Furman to a 58-55 win over East Tennessee State in Johnson City...also had five points against Clemson (67-54 loss)...registered five assists and two steals (no turnovers) in 13 minutes of action in an 84-51 win over VMI in Greenville...had a pair of assists and three steals in 10 minutes of work against The Citadel in Greenville (69-47 win)...was one of only two players (Bubba Smith) to tally more assists (23) than turnovers (16).

AS A FRESHMAN (1997-98): Registered playing time as a backup to starting second guard Bubba Smith in 25 of Furman's 29 games...sustained a bruised clavicle

early in Furman's 64-54 loss to Chattanooga in Greenville in late January and was sidelined for the next two games versus The Citadel and Appalachian State...later returned to action but played sparingly in four of the Paladins' last seven games, averaging only 4.5 minutes per game...best performance of the year came in Furman's 70-61 win over Wofford in Greenville when, in 34 minutes of action, he scored seven points, claimed six rebounds and garnered three assists...tallied five points and claimed a pair of rebounds in a 71-62 loss to Clemson at Clemson...knocked down 2x3 3-point attempts for six points in a 62-58 loss to Tennessee Tech at the San Juan Shootout...scored four points and had four rebounds in a 79-52 loss to South Carolina in Greenville.

HIGH SCHOOL: 1997 graduate of Miami Senior High School...basketball coach was Frank Martin...played the point and second guard positions...averaged 18.0 points per game and was named Miami Senior's Mr. Basketball, second team all-county, and state all-tournament as a senior after helping his squad to a second straight state championship...helped Miami Senior to a 30-8 record and state title his junior year...also played football in high school...had 20 receptions for 400 yards as a senior.

GENERAL: Solid, experienced performer who ranks as Furman's most veteran performer and one of the Southern Conference's top perimeter defenders...has registered three years of starting experience at two positions: point guard and small forward...expected to contend for the starting role at small forward and provide needed leadership on the floor...possesses deceptively long reach and the ability to generate a quality shot off dribble penetration or in post-up situations...stands as one of the team's strongest players following three years of consistent work in the weight room...was the first player signed by Furman head coach Larry Davis when he inked with the Paladins in April of 1997.

AS A JUNIOR (1999-00): Made the move from starting point guard to small forward, where in 32 games he averaged 7.3 ppg and 4.2 rpg...hit for double figures in four of the Paladins' first six games...in all registered 10 double figure scoring performances, including a season high 14-point, 12-rebound outing in a 125-53 win over Southeastern...tallied 13 points and 10 rebounds in a 71-59 victory over Bethune-Cookman...tallied a season high five assists against Chattanooga in Greenville (67-60 win).

AS A SOPHOMORE (1998-99): Fashioned noteworthy improvement in his second season as starting point guard, upping his scoring average to 8.4 ppg and rebounding average to 3.4 rpg...started in all 28 games and shot 42.5% from the field while collecting 57 assists...led Furman with 27 steals...scored a career high 15 points against the College of Charleston (98-74 loss) in Southern Conference Tourney action...tallied 14 points in an 83-78 overtime win over Duquesne and in a 92-70 loss to Davidson...outing against Duquesne included a 10x13 free throw performance.

AS A FRESHMAN (1997-98): Named to the Southern Conference All-Freshman Team...arguably may have been handed the toughest assignment of any player when he was named the Paladins' starting point guard prior to the beginning of the season...assignment forced him to make the transition from prep combination

guard/small forward to collegiate point guard...registered consecutive season high 13-point performances in a 61-54 loss to Georgia Southern in Statesboro and a 63-54 loss to Davidson...totaled a season high six assists against Western Carolina (95-78 loss)...accounted for all nine points at the free throw line and had three steals in a 72-66 overtime win over Georgia Southern in Greenville.

HIGH SCHOOL: 1997 graduate of Highland High School...basketball coach was Tom Ward...averaged 21.3 points, 12.3 rebounds, and 5.5 assists per game as a senior in helping Highland to an 18-11 record, district and quarterfinal championships, and quarterfinal finish in the Missouri AA State Tournament...earned conference player-of-the-year, as well as all-area, all-district, and all-state accolades...tallied a team high 26 points and collected 14 rebounds en route to earning team MVP honors in the 15th Annual Quincy (Ill.) Herald-Whig/McDonald's All-Star Classic...was also named MVP following a 23-point performance in a 102-98 loss in the 15th Annual Northeast Missouri Officials Association All-Star Game...as a junior, earned all-conference, all-area, all-district, and all-state laurels after leading Highland to a 19-6 record and conference title.

GENERAL: Veteran point guard who has positioned himself as a major contributor in Furman's program following a strong finish to the 1999-00 campaign...heads into the year as the backup to projected starter Guilherme Da Luz but will see plenty of quality time based on proven ability...will also play in combination with Da Luz when extra quality ballhandling and passing skill is required...overall game has benefited noticeably from solid work in the weight room over the past two years...can be effective from 3-point range and is a solid free throw shooter...boasts a strong understanding of the game...was the first of Furman's five-member recruiting class to sign with the Paladins when he inked his national letter of intent in December of 1997.

AS A SOPHOMORE (1999-00): Posted solid improvement over the course of the season while working as a backup to starting point guard Guilherme Da Luz...logged playing time in all 32 games and averaged 13.5 minutes and 2.0 ppg...recorded 27 assists and committed only five turnovers over the Paladins' final 13 games...finished the season with 61 assists, 22 steals, and only 31 turnovers...assist total was second highest on team...tied a Furman school record with seven steals in a 125-53 win over Southeastern...stepped up with solid play in Southern Conference Tournament action, totaling seven assists and a steal (and only two turnovers) in 22 minutes of action in the Paladins' 60-56 loss to Appalachian State in the semifinals...tallied a season high eight points and two assists in helping Furman snap a 15-game road losing streak with a 71-68 win over VMI.

AS A FRESHMAN (1998-99): Saw action in all 28 games working as the primary backup to point guard Marcus Dilligard...averaged 17.4 minutes and 3.1 ppg...connected on 38.7% of his 3-point attempts (12x31) and shot a solid 70.5% from the free throw line (31x44)...converted a season high 8x13 free throws on the way to a season high 11 points in an 88-85 win over Charleston Southern in Greenville...registered 10 points and knocked down a pair of big 3-pointers in a 58-55

win over East Tennessee State in Johnson City...garnered a season high five assists against Northwestern (62-55 loss)...tallied six points with a pair of 3-pointers in a 92-70 win over Greensboro...collected a season high four steals against William & Mary (79-67 win) in Williamsburg.

HIGH SCHOOL: 1998 graduate of Wallace-Rose Hill High School...basketball coach was Steve Robinson...was the starting point guard on Wallace-Rose Hill's 31-0 state AA championship team...scored seven points and had 10 assists in Wallace-Rose Hill's 72-56 win over North Stanly in the state championship game...averaged 10.5 points and 8.5 assists per game and earned All-East Central Conference, all east regional tournament, and all-state honors as a senior...began his prep career at Southern Wayne High School in Dudley, N.C., where he was a starter in each of his first three seasons of play...twice earned All-Mideastern Conference honors after helping Southern Wayne to three straight league championships and a cumulative 60-20 record...attended Oak Hill (Va.) Academy at the start of his senior season but soon returned to North Carolina and enrolled at Wallace-Rose Hill.

GENERAL: Appears poised for a fine year following a solid 1999-00 season that included noteworthy improvement in virtually every area...should again start at the wing guard position but can also play the small forward slot in certain situations...ranks as Furman's top perimeter shooter...sports a good knowledge of the game and a quick first step...likes to dribble penetrate and is proficient at getting the ball on the glass in quick fashion...like his teammates, has benefited from extensive work in the weight room over the last two years...excellent student.

AS A SOPHOMORE (1999-00): Earned starts at the wing guard position in 26 of Furman's 32 games and averaged 9.5 ppg and 3.4 rpg...posted solid improvement in field goal percentage over his freshman season (43.3% vs. 35.0%), including a notable jump in 3-point percentage (36.2% vs. 21.7%)...converted 17x41 3-pointers (41.4%) over the final 10 games, helping Furman to a 6-4 record during that span...knocked down 5-of-7 3-point attempts as part of an 18-point performance in an 80-73 win over East Tennessee State in Greenville...recorded the finest game of his career in the Paladins' 77-61 win over UNC Greensboro in Southern Conference Tournament first round action, scoring 19 points and claiming eight rebounds, and five steals against the Spartans...tallied a career high 20 points in a 125-53 triumph over Southeastern.

AS A FRESHMAN (1998-99): Fashioned a solid freshman season despite a pair of late season injuries...started at small forward in 22 of 25 games and averaging 6.5 ppg and 3.6 rpg...appeared to be on his way to strong Southern Conference All-Freshman Team consideration until suffering a concussion in the final seconds of Furman's 58-55 win over East Tennessee State and a sprained knee two games later against Western Carolina...had averaged 10.3 ppg and 4.0 rpg in the six games prior to concussion...managed only 2.2 ppg and 1.8 rpg over the final 10 contests...scored a season high 13 points (5x6 FTs) in an 81-68 loss to College of Charleston in Greenville...tallied 12 points and claimed six rebounds

in the Paladins' 83-73 overtime loss to The Citadel in Charleston...posted 10 points and a season high seven boards against Greensboro College (92-70 win).

HIGH SCHOOL: 1998 graduate of Woodward Academy...basketball coach was Tony Watkins...prep career included action at shooting guard and at small forward...participated in the Georgia North-South and Georgia-Tennessee All-Star Games...averaged 21.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game in helping his squad to a 20-5 record and state playoff appearance his senior year...earned region player-of-the-year for the third straight season, All-Metro Atlanta, and Atlanta Journal-Constitution All-State second team honors...as junior garnered state AAA Player-of-the-Year, first team all-state, and All-Metro Atlanta honors after averaging 18.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in pacing Woodward Academy to a 27-2 record and appearance in state Final Four...squad was selected as the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Team-of-the-Year in 1997...shot 53.4 percent (618-of-1156) from the field, 73.4% (327-of-445) from the line, and tallied 1,753 points, 573 rebounds, 202 steals, and 139 assists in his prep career...Woodward Academy went 91-16 during his four-year tenure.

GENERAL: Considered a major key to Furman's potential success this year...projected to start at center following a fine freshman campaign that saw him work in both a starting and backup role...gives Furman's front line much-needed bulk and strength and sports a very strong understanding of the game...has battled a progressive neuromuscular foot disorder known as Charcot-Marie-Tooth since joining the program...disorder affects the extremities...ability to remain healthy will be a huge factor in Furman's potential success this year due to the lack of experienced post players in program.

ASA FRESHMAN (1999-00): Fashioned a promising first season as a Paladin, starting at center in 21 games and seeing action in 28 of the team's 32 contests...averaged 5.8 ppg and 3.9 rpg...was less than 100 percent physically for much of the season due to a progressive neuromuscular foot disorder known as Charcot-Marie-Tooth, but still contributed quality play...missed four games with an ankle sprain unrelated to disorder...grabbed attention early with a strong 12-point performance in the Paladins' 68-65 win over Old Dominion in the consolation championship game of the SoCon Holiday Hoops Tournament in November...performance against the Monarchs featured a game winning , back door pass and assist to Karim Souchu, whose bucket with 22 seconds left broke a 65-65 tie...poured in a season high 23 points and tallied three assists in a 97-75 triumph over Coastal Carolina...followed it up with a 12-point, 7-rebound performance in a 70-59 win over Bethune-Cookman in Greenville...registered a season high nine rebounds in a 76-59 win over Oglethorpe...worked as a reserve behind Stanislav Makshantsev in

his last seven games.

HIGH SCHOOL: 1999 graduate of Paul G. Blazer High School...head coach was Mike Flynn...played power forward...averaged 19.0 ppg and 9.7 rpg as a senior in helping Blazer to the regional finals...earned all-state and all-district honors...was selected to play in the prestigious Kentucky-Indiana All-Star Doubleheader...combined to score 20 points and claim 17 rebounds in both contests.
