**FURMAN-COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON
 SERIES INFORMATION
 (Furman leads 37-16)**

Wednesday's game will mark the 54th meeting between Furman and College of Charleston, with the Paladins holding a 37-16 series lead. The Cougars, however, enter Wednesday's clash riding a five-game winning streak over the Paladins since joining the Southern Conference in 1998. Prior to that, the two schools had last met on the hardwood during the 1971-72 season in Greenville (93-74 Furman win). A year ago College of Charleston routed Furman 77-50 in Charleston and later edged the Paladins 56-51 in Greenville. Furman sports a 19-6 record versus the Cougars in Greenville and 18-9 mark in Charleston. The Cougars are 1-0 against Furman in the only neutral site clash between the two schools.

NOTING THE PALADINS

NEXT UP, COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON... Furman returns to action on Wednesday, Jan. 3 when it takes on the College of Charleston Cougars at Timmons Arena in a 5:30 p.m. game televised live by Comcast Sports Southeast. The College of Charleston enters Wednesday's clash against Furman sporting the best overall record (9-2) in the Southern Conference and a 1-0 league mark thanks to its 57-56 win over Chattanooga in Chattanooga back on Nov. 20. The Cougars split a pair of games at the Tournament of Champions in Charlotte over the weekend, guarding Richmond 52-48 on Friday before falling to 16th-ranked North Carolina 64-60 on Saturday. Junior guard Jeff Bolton led the Cougar effort against North Carolina with 25 points. Senior center Jody Lumpkin tallied 16 points and 10 rebounds in the victory over Richmond. Winners of five straight over Furman, the Cougars topped the Paladins 56-51 in Greenville last year.

UNUSUAL TIP... In a rare scheduling move, Furman's men's team will play the first game of Wednesday's home doubleheader beginning at 5:30 p.m. to avoid a conflict with the Orange Bowl/BCS National Championship game between Florida State and Miami scheduled for later that evening. Furman's women's team will take on UNC Greensboro beginning at 7:30 p.m.

FURMAN THE LAST TIME OUT... Freshman guard/forward Jorge Seraphim scored 16 points to pace five double figure scorers in the Paladins' 93-55 win over Crossfire Ministries in a rare December exhibition game Saturday night at Timmons Arena. Seraphim converted 6-of-10 field goals, including 3-of-4 3-pointers, and had two dunks in the victory. Karim Souchu added 14 points, Maleye Ndoye 13, Guilherme Da Luz 12, and Anthony Thomas 11 for the Paladins, who shot a blistering 59.1 percent (39x66) from the field. The game against Crossfire Ministries marked the first action for the Paladins since Dec. 21 when Furman dropped a 68-56 decision to New Mexico in Albuquerque. Against the Lobos, Furman fought back from a 16-point second half deficit to get to within two points at 51-49 following a steal and dunk by Karim Souchu with 7:59 left, but poor shooting by the Paladins down the stretch ended Furman's upset bid. Souchu paced Furman scorers with 14 points and led all rebounders with nine, and Anthony Thomas added 13 points. Maleye Ndoye helped spark the second half Paladin comeback with eight points in 14 minutes off the bench.

HOME AGAIN... Wednesday evening's clash with the College of Charleston will mark the Paladins' first home game since Dec. 9 when the Paladins downed Stetson 85-66. Counting Wednesday's game against the Cougars, the Paladins, who have played only three games (home and away) in the past 29 days, will play four of their next five contests at home. Following a clash against Wofford in Spartanburg on Saturday, Furman returns to Timmons Arena for successive games against VMI (Jan. 10), UNC Greensboro (Jan. 13), and Georgia Southern (Jan. 15) before hitting the road against East Tennessee State on Jan. 20. Currently 3-0 at home this season, Furman owns a modest five-game winning streak in Timmons Arena. Ironically, the last team to defeat Furman at home was the College of Charleston, which downed the Paladins 56-51 on Feb. 12 last year. The Paladins have compiled a 28-16 home record (.636) in a little more than three seasons under head coach Larry Davis.

➤ **MORE COMPETITIVE ON THE ROAD...**Two of Furman's five wins this season have come on the road, and that's big news at Furman because it's double the number of road victories the Paladins totaled last year when Furman went 1-11 in 12 away contests. The two road triumphs this year include an 81-67 thumping of Coastal Carolina (Nov. 25) and a 79-74 overtime win over Florida State (Dec. 4).

➤ **SOUCHU LEADING THE SOCON...**Sophomore forward Karim Souchu (Paris, France), who in early October earned *The Basketball News'* Southern Conference Preseason Player-of-the-Year tab, has gotten off to a solid start in the Paladins' first nine games, averaging a Southern Conference leading 20.4 points per game. Souchu, who Dec. 5 was named Southern Conference Player-of-the-Week, also paces Furman and ranks fourth in the league in rebounding (7.1 rpg). A third team All-Southern Conference selection and first team all-tournament pick last year, he has topped Furman in scoring in eight of the Paladins' nine games. Souchu's 15.8 ppg average a year ago was the highest by a Furman freshman since George Singleton averaged 16.1 ppg during the 1980-81 season. The last Furman player to average at least 20.0 ppg in a season was Mel Daniel, who poured in 22.0 ppg during the 1980-81 season.

➤ **RAMADAN OVER FOR SOUCHU, NDOYE...**Furman sophomore forward Karim Souchu (Paris, France) and freshman forward Maleye Ndoye (Dakar, Senegal) are Muslim and, therefore, observed the holy month of Ramadan, which ran through Dec. 27. In accordance with tenets of their faith, Souchu and Ndoye fasted (refusing food and water) from sunrise to sunset during Ramadan, regardless of whether the Paladins practiced or played during the day.

➤ **ZEIGLER STEPPING UP...**When a foot disorder ended 6-foot-7, 255-pound sophomore center Darrell Arbaugh's collegiate basketball career prior to the start of the season, the Paladins' lost two inches and 45 pounds at the starting center position. Fortunately, though, Furman has experienced no production cut on the court thus far as Arbaugh's replacement, sophomore Kenny Zeigler (Lithonia, Ga.) has stepped up by averaging a solid 10.4 ppg and 6.0 rpg while shooting a team leading 58.5% from the field in nine starts at center. Zeigler, who stands 6-foot-5 and weighs 210 pounds (up from 190 his freshman year), has registered several strong performances in his new role this year, including a 17-point, 6-rebound effort in a 78-64 loss at Vanderbilt and a 22-point, 10-rebound outing in an 81-67 win at Coastal Carolina. As a freshman a year ago Zeigler averaged 5.5 ppg and 4.4 rpg.

➤ **TAKING CARE OF THE BALL...**A telling statistic behind Furman's improvement over the last couple of years has been a noteworthy decrease in its turnover ratio and corresponding increase in assist, assist/turnover, and steal ratios. In 1998-99 the Paladins averaged 18.3 turnovers/game and finished 12-16. Last year Furman averaged 15.1 turnovers/game on the way to a 14-18 slate. Through nine games this year the Paladins are averaging 12.4 turnovers/game.

➤ **PALADIN POINTERS...**Furman has been successful in limiting the effectiveness of opponents' perimeter attacks as evidenced by the fact the Paladins lead the Southern Conference in 3-point percentage defense (25.2 percent). After getting

within four points (68-64) with 2:27 to go against Vanderbilt on Dec. 16, Furman missed its final seven field goal attempts and was outscored 10-0 in the 78-64 loss to the Commodores. Against New Mexico on Dec. 21, Furman again went cold down the stretch. After slicing a 16-point deficit to 51-49 at the 7:59 mark, the Paladins went only 2-of-8 from the field the rest of the way in the 68-56 loss.

➤ **THOMAS FINDING THE MARK...**In converting 11-of-27 3-pointers (40.7 percent) in Furman's last four games, junior guard Anthony Thomas (Atlanta, Ga.) continued to display an improved shooting touch from long range. As a freshman two years ago Thomas converted only 21.7 percent of his 3-point attempts (13x60). Last year he bumped that figure to 36.2 percent (38x105), and through eight games this year he is knocking down 37.5 percent of his 3-point shots (21x56). Paralleling Thomas' improved 3-point shooting is his scoring average: 6.5 ppg (1998-99), 9.5 ppg (1999-00), and 12.4 ppg (2000-01).

➤ **DA LUZ RUNNING THE SHOW...**A big factor in Furman's improvement over the past year and good start this season has been the development of point guard Guilherme Da Luz, who heads into the College of Charleston contest averaging a solid 11.1 ppg, 4.0 rpg, and 5.7 apg (third in SoCon). More importantly, though, Da Luz has committed only 25 turnovers through nine games. In Furman's 85-66 win over Stetson on Dec. 9, Da Luz played an extremely solid game, scoring 16 points and collecting 10 assists, two rebounds, and two steals (only two turnovers) in 31 minutes of action. The 10 assists marked the second highest single game total of his career and fifth highest in school history. His display against Stetson followed a brilliant performance in the Paladins' 79-74 overtime victory over Florida State in Tallahassee on Dec. 4 when he registered 17 points, six rebounds, seven assists, and five steals (three turnovers) in 40 minutes of playing time. As a freshman a year ago Da Luz tied Furman's single season assist standard (159) and set a new school single game assist record with 14 dishes in a 97-75 triumph over Coastal Carolina.

➤ **NERVE DISORDER ENDS ARBAUGH'S CAREER...**Furman head coach Larry Davis announced on Nov. 27 that sophomore center Darrell Arbaugh's collegiate basketball career has been cut short due to a progressive neurological foot disorder known as Charcot-Marie-Tooth (CMT). Arbaugh, a 6-foot-7, 255-pound product of Ashland, Ky., who earned starts in 21 of Furman's 28 games a year ago, and who averaged 5.8 ppg and 3.0 rpg, was diagnosed as suffering from CMT this past spring by doctors at Duke University Medical Center. Upon returning to school in August, Arbaugh began experiencing more severe symptoms of the disorder and, following another evaluation, was advised to retire to eliminate an increasing risk of leg and knee injuries. The inherited disorder, which affects 150,000 Americans, causes patients to slowly lose normal use of their feet/legs, and hands/arms as nerves to the extremities degenerate.

➤ **FURMAN INKS PAIR IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD...**Furman head coach Larry Davis announced the signing of two recruits in November. Nick Sanders, a 6-foot-7 forward from Leavenworth, Kansas, and 6-foot-4 forward Jason Patterson from Lithonia, Ga., signed national letters of intent with the Paladins. Sanders, a three-year starter, all-conference, and all-state selection at Leavenworth High School, averaged 11.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg as a junior a year ago while helping his squad to a 23-2 record and 6A state championship -- the highest classification in Kansas. He scored a team high 16 points in Leavenworth's 59-56 win over Junction City in the state championship game. Working as his squad's sixth man as a junior, Patterson averaged 7.8 points and 5.8 rebounds per game as on a Lithonia High School team that posted a 24-7 record and finished as state AAA runner-up. This past summer the former teammate of Paladin sophomore Kenny Zeigler averaged 16.0 points in 12 AAU games with Team Carolina and the Atlanta Celtics.
