**FURMAN-GEORGIA SOUTHERN  
SERIES INFORMATION  
(Furman leads 12-9)**

Monday's game will mark the 22nd meeting between Furman and Georgia Southern in a series the Paladins lead 12-9. The Paladins captured two of last year's three clashes, earning an 80-73 decision in Greenville behind Stanislav Makshantsev's 20 points, and later posting a 68-54 win in Southern Conference Tournament play behind Karim Souchu's game high 18-point effort. Julius Jenkins scored 23 points to pace Georgia Southern to an 89-77 win over Furman in Statesboro. The Eagles' last win in Greenville, a 51-49 verdict, came during the 1998-99 season. The Paladins are 8-4 versus Georgia Southern in Greenville, including the conference tournament game. The Eagles own a 5-4 ledger against the Paladins in Statesboro.

**NOTING THE PALADINS**

**PALADIN POINTERS**...Sophomore forward Karim Souchu leads the Southern Conference in scoring (19.7 ppg) and has been the leading scorer in 12 of the Paladins' 13 games...sophomore point guard Guilherme Da Luz has averaged 7.0 rpg and has converted 9-of-19 three-point attempts (47.4 percent) over the past four games...Da Luz now has 233 career assists and is only four assists shy of cracking Furman's Top 10 career assist ledger...Furman's 8-of-13 three-point shooting performance in Saturday's 70-52 win over UNC Greensboro marked the fifth best single game three-point shooting percentage effort in school history...Furman leads the Southern Conference in three-point percentage defense (25.9 percent) and is second in assist/turnover ratio (+1.10)...Furman's three road wins this season, including a 79-74 overtime victory over Florida State on Dec. 4, are already two more than the Paladins earned in 12 road contests last year (1-11)...6-foot-5 sophomore center Kenny Zeigler has averaged 12.5 ppg and 10.3 rpg in four Southern Conference games this season...Furman has led 37-25 at intermission in each of its past two games (vs. VMI and UNC Greensboro).

**NEXT UP, GEORGIA SOUTHERN**...Furman completes a three-game home stand — its longest of the year — when it takes on Southern Conference South Division member Georgia Southern Monday night at Timmons Arena in a 7:30 p.m. game. Georgia Southern comes into Greenville with a 5-10 overall record and 1-3 Southern Conference slate, but two of the Eagles' three league setbacks have come to College of Charleston (86-65 loss) and Chattanooga (83-76 loss), two of the league's strongest teams. Led by Kashien Latham's and Sean Peterson's respective 17-point scoring performances, Georgia Southern placed five players in double figures and forced 23 Davidson turnovers in the Eagles' 84-70 win over the Wildcats in Statesboro on Saturday. Georgia Southern enters Monday's game against Furman leading the league in scoring offense (77.1 ppg) and field goal shooting percentage (45.4 percent). Sophomore guard Julius Jenkins ranks third in the conference in scoring (16.5 ppg), and in junior forward Kashien Latham the Eagles possess the conference's second leading rebounder (8.5 rpg). Junior college transfer guard Sean Peterson has provided Georgia Southern with solid playmaking skills and versatility (13.4 ppg, 4.1 rpg, 87 assists) thus far.

**FURMAN THE LAST TIME OUT**...Karim Souchu scored 18 points and paced the Paladins' season best three-point shooting effort (8x13, 61.5 percent) with a pair of treys to lead Furman to a convincing 70-52 win over visiting UNC Greensboro Saturday night at Timmons Arena. Furman, which led from start to finish, raced to an early double digit lead and was never seriously threatened by the Spartans, who trailed 37-25 at intermission. Furman shot 48.2 percent from the field (27x56) and held UNC Greensboro to 35.6 percent shooting (21x59), including a 2-of-11 effort by point guard Courtney Eldridge, who finished with just five points. The Paladins, led by Marcus Dilligard's nine caroms, also outrebounded the taller Spartans 41-32, including 22-12 over the game's final 20 minutes. Kenny Zeigler registered 13 points and seven rebounds, and Guilherme Da Luz scored 12 points to go along with seven rebounds and seven assists.

**ZEIGLER STEPPING UP...**When a foot disorder ended 6-foot-7, 255-pound sophomore center Darrell Arbaugh's collegiate basketball career prior to the start of the season, the Paladins' lost two inches and 45 pounds at the starting center position. Fortunately, though, Furman has experienced no production cut on the court thus far as Arbaugh's replacement, sophomore Kenny Zeigler (Lithonia, Ga.) has stepped up by averaging a solid 11.1 ppg and 7.3 rpg (fifth in SoCon) while shooting a team leading 53.3 percent from the field in 13 starts at center. Zeigler, who stands 6-foot-5 and weighs 210 pounds (up from 190 his freshman year), has been even more effective against Southern Conference competition, averaging 12.5 ppg and 10.3 rpg in four league games, including a strong 15-point, 12-rebound effort in the Paladins' 70-62 win at Wofford on Jan. 6. His top performance of the season was a 22-point, 10-rebound outing in an 81-67 win at Coastal Carolina on Nov 25. As a freshman a year ago Zeigler averaged 5.5 ppg and 4.4 rpg.

**SOUCHU LEADING THE WAY...**Sophomore forward Karim Souchu (Paris, France), who in early October earned *The Basketball News'* Southern Conference Preseason Player-of-the-Year tab, has gotten off to a solid start in the Paladins' first 13 games, averaging a Southern Conference leading 19.7 points per game. Souchu, who on Dec. 5 was named Southern Conference Player-of-the-Week, also paces Furman and ranks eighth in the league in rebounding (6.3 rpg). A third team All-Southern Conference selection and first team all-tournament pick last year, he has topped Furman in scoring in 12 of the Paladins' 13 games, including a game high 21-point effort in the Paladins' 70-62 win at Wofford on Jan. 6 and an 18-point show in Saturday's 70-52 win over UNC Greensboro. Souchu's 15.8 ppg average a year ago was the highest by a Furman freshman since George Singleton averaged 16.1 ppg during the 1980-81 season. The last Furman player to average at least 20.0 ppg in a season was Mel Daniel, who poured in 22.0 ppg during the 1980-81 season.

**TAKING CARE OF THE BALL...**A telling statistic behind Furman's improvement over the last couple of years has been a noteworthy decrease in its turnover ratio and corresponding increase in assist, assist/turnover, and steal ratios. In 1998-99 the Paladins averaged 18.3 turnovers/game and finished 12-16. Last year Furman averaged 15.1 turnovers/game on the way to a 14-18 slate. Through 13 games this year the Paladins are averaging 12.5 turnovers/game and rank second in the Southern Conference in assist/turnover ratio (1.10).

**DA LUZ PUTTING UP THE NUMBERS...**A big factor in Furman's improvement over the past year and good start this season has been the development of point guard Guilherme Da Luz, who heads into the Georgia Southern contest averaging a solid 11.6 ppg, 4.9 rpg, and 5.7 apg. In addition to his scoring and playmaking abilities, another aspect of Da Luz's game that deserves notice is his rebounding. Not many point guards average nearly 5.0 rebounds per game, and in four league contests this year the 6-foot-3 Brazilian has averaged 7.0 rebounds. In the Paladins' 54-51 loss to College of Charleston on Jan. 3, Da Luz claimed a career high 11 rebounds, and in Saturday's 70-52 triumph over UNC Greensboro he claimed seven boards to go along with seven assists and 12 points while also holding Spartan point guard Courtney Eldridge to 2-of-11 shooting and five points, some 10 points below his season average. In addition, Da Luz has stepped up his shooting from 3-point range, having converted 9-of-19 three-pointers (47.4 percent) over the past four games. In Furman's 85-66 win over Stetson on Dec. 9, Da Luz played an extremely solid game, scoring 16 points and collecting 10 assists, two rebounds, and two steals in 31 minutes of action. The 10 assists marked the second highest single game total of his career and fifth highest in school history. His display against Stetson followed a brilliant performance in the Paladins' 79-74 overtime victory over Florida State in Tallahassee on Dec. 4 when he registered 17 points, six rebounds, seven assists, and five steals (three turnovers) in 40 minutes of playing time. As a freshman a year ago Da Luz tied Furman's single season assist standard (159) and set a new school single game assist record with 14 dishes in a 97-75 triumph

over Coastal Carolina.

**TURNING IT AROUND ON THE ROAD...**In knocking off Wofford 70-62 in Spartanburg on Jan. 6, Furman improved its road record this season to 3-4. The three road wins thus far might not seem that impressive, but it takes on new meaning when considering the Paladins went 1-11 in 12 away contests a year ago. In addition to the victory at Wofford, Furman has thumped Coastal Carolina (81-67) and Florida State (79-74 OT) on the road this year. Counting last year's 71-68 win at VMI, the Paladins are now 4-4 in their last eight road games. That's noteworthy improvement over the 4-31 road record (11.4%) Furman registered in Larry Davis' first 35 road contests spanning almost three seasons.

**DEFENDING THE "3"...**Furman has been successful in limiting the effectiveness of opponents' perimeter attacks as evidenced by the fact the Paladins lead the Southern Conference in three-point percentage defense (25.9 percent). In Saturday's 70-52 triumph over UNC Greensboro, the Paladins held the league's best three-point shooting squad (35.3 percent, 6x17) under its season percentage (38.1 percent).

**THOMAS FINDING THE MARK...**In converting 17-of-43 three-pointers (39.5 percent) in Furman's last eight games, junior guard Anthony Thomas (Atlanta, Ga.) continued to display an improved shooting touch from long range. As a freshman two years ago Thomas converted only 21.7 percent of his three-point attempts (13x60). Last year he bumped that figure to 36.2 percent (38x105), and through 13 games this year he is knocking down 37.5 percent of his three-point shots (27x72). Paralleling Thomas' improved three-point shooting is his scoring average: 6.5 ppg (1998-99), 9.5 ppg (1999-00), and 11.7 ppg (2000-01).

**NERVE DISORDER ENDS ARBAUGH'S CAREER...**Furman head coach Larry Davis announced on Nov. 27 that sophomore center Darrell Arbaugh's collegiate basketball career has been cut short due to a progressive neurological foot disorder known as Charcot-Marie-Tooth (CMT). Arbaugh, a 6-foot-7, 255-pound product of Ashland, Ky., who earned starts in 21 of Furman's 28 games a year ago, and who averaged 5.8 ppg and 3.0 rpg, was diagnosed as suffering from CMT this past spring by doctors at Duke University Medical Center. Upon returning to school in August, Arbaugh began experiencing more severe symptoms of the disorder and, following another evaluation, was advised to retire to eliminate an increasing risk of leg and knee injuries. The inherited disorder, which affects 150,000 Americans, causes patients to slowly lose normal use of their feet/legs, and hands/arms as nerves to the extremities degenerate.

**FURMAN INKS PAIR IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD...**Furman head coach Larry Davis announced the signing of two recruits in November. Nick Sanders (3.85 GPA), a 6-foot-7 forward from Leavenworth, Kansas, and 6-foot-4 forward Jason Patterson (3.95 GPA) from Lithonia, Ga., signed national letters of intent with the Paladins. Sanders, a three-year starter, all-conference, and all-state selection at Leavenworth High School, averaged 11.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg as a junior a year ago while helping his squad to a 23-2 record and 6A state championship -- the highest classification in Kansas. Working as his squad's sixth man as a junior, Patterson averaged 7.8 points and 5.8 rebounds per game as on a Lithonia High School team that posted a 24-7 record and finished as state AAA runner-up. This past summer the former teammate of Paladin sophomore Kenny Zeigler averaged 16.0 points in 12 AAU games with Team Carolina and the Atlanta Celtics.
