**FURMAN-STETSON
SERIES INFORMATION
(Stetson leads 6-4)**

✍ Saturday's game will mark the 11th meeting between Furman and Stetson in a series that the Hatters lead 6-4. Using 14-point efforts from Sebastian Singletary and Santos Hampton, Stetson topped Furman 63-60 last year in DeLand. The Paladins downed the Hatters 66-59 in Greenville during the 1998-99 season behind Anthony Thomas' team high 16 points. Furman holds a slim 3-2 advantage over Stetson in Greenville. In DeLand, however, the Paladins are just 1-4 versus the Hatters.

NOTING THE PALADINS

✍ **NEXT UP, STETSON**...Furman takes on its third consecutive sunshine state opponent Saturday when it hosts Stetson at Timmons Arena in a 7:30 p.m. contest. The Paladins dropped a 63-56 decision to Bethune-Cookman last Saturday in Daytona Beach before bouncing back with the program's biggest win in recent years, a 79-74 overtime decision over Florida State in Tallahassee in a contest Furman led virtually from wire to wire. Karim Souchu (Paris, France) paced Furman's attack against the Seminoles with 24 points, and Anthony Thomas (Atlanta, Ga.) contributed 18, mainly on 5x10 shooting from 3-point range. Point guard Guilherme Da Luz (Sao Paulo, Brazil), however, stole the spotlight with 17 points, six rebounds, seven assists, and five steals. The win was the first by Furman over an Atlantic Coast Conference team since the Paladins topped Wake Forest 80-68 in Winston-Salem during the 1987-88 season. Stetson enters Saturday's contest at 3-3 on the season. The Hatters, who started the year 3-0, dropped a 74-64 decision to Western Carolina Thursday night in Cullowhee despite a 17-point, 13-rebound effort from senior forward Sebastian Singletary and 16-point, 14-rebound performance by junior center Santos Hampton.

✍ **SOUCHU OFF TO FAST START**...Sophomore forward Karim Souchu (Paris, France), who in early October earned *The Basketball News'* Southern Conference Preseason Player-of-the-Year tab, has gotten off to a fast start in the Paladins' first six games, averaging a Southern Conference leading 22.7 points per game. Souchu, who on Monday was named Southern Conference Player-of-the-Week after averaging 23.0 ppg and 7.0 rpg in two games last week, is shooting a solid 54.5% from the field (55x101) and 37.5% from 3-point range (9x24) this year. A third team All-Southern Conference selection and first team all-tournament pick last year, he has paced Furman in scoring in five of the Paladins' six games, topping the 20-point plateau in five contests. Souchu's 15.8 ppg average a year ago was the highest by a Furman freshman since George Singleton averaged 16.1 ppg during the 1980-81 season. The last Furman player to average at least 20.0 ppg in a season was Mel Daniel, who poured in 22.0 ppg during the 1980-81 season.

✍ **ROAD WARRIORS**...Two of Furman's four wins this season have come on the road, and that's big news because it's double the number of road victories the Paladins totaled last year when Furman went 1-11 in 12 away contests. Counting last year's 81-68 win over VMI in Lexington, Va., in the regular season finale and road victories over Coastal Carolina (81-67) and Florida State (79-74 ot) this year, the Paladins have, in fact, won three of their last five away contests.

✍ **WAUGH RETURNS TO FU**...When Furman takes on Stetson this Saturday, former Paladin basketball standout Derek Waugh (1980-93) will be sitting on Stetson's bench assisting the Hatters' coaching efforts. Currently in his fourth season as an assistant coach at Stetson, Waugh was a popular and successful member of Furman's basketball program from 1990-93, earning Southern Conference Freshman-of-the-Year honors in 1990 and consensus first team all-conference honors in 1993, his senior year. One of only 32 Paladin players to score more than 1,000 points in career (1,405), Waugh ranks seventh on Furman's career rebounding chart (862) and, as a senior, became the first player in Paladin basketball history to garner GTE Academic All-America honors. Following graduation in 1993, he earned his juris doctorate from Wake Forest University and practiced law for one year in his native Atlanta before entering the coaching ranks.

🔪 **FINDING THE MARK...**In converting 5x10 3-pointers in Furman's 79-74 overtime win over Florida State on Monday, junior guard Anthony Thomas (Atlanta, Ga.) continued to display an improved shooting touch from long range. As a freshman two years ago Thomas converted only 21.7% of his 3-point attempts (13x60). Last year he bumped that figure to 36.2% (38x105), and through six games this year he is knocking down 38.5% of his 3-point shots (15x39). Paralleling Thomas' improved 3-point shooting is his scoring average: 6.5 ppg (1998-99), 9.5 ppg (1999-00), and 12.5 ppg (2000-01).

🔪 **TAKING CARE OF THE BALL...**A telling statistic behind Furman's improvement over the last couple of years has been a noteworthy decrease in its turnover ratio and corresponding increase in assist, assist/turnover, and steal ratios. In 1998-99 the Paladins averaged 18.3 turnovers/game and finished 12-16. Last year Furman averaged 15.1 turnovers/game on the way to a 14-18 slate. Through six games this year the Paladins have sliced their turnover ratio to 13.2/game.

🔪 **NERVE DISORDER ENDS ARBAUGH'S CAREER...**Furman head coach Larry Davis announced on Monday, Nov. 27 that sophomore center Darrell Arbaugh's collegiate basketball career has been cut short due to a progressive neurological foot disorder known as Charcot-Marie-Tooth (CMT). Arbaugh, a 6-foot-7, 255-pound product of Ashland, Ky., who earned starts in 21 of Furman's 28 games a year ago, and who averaged 5.8 ppg and 3.0 rpg, was diagnosed as suffering from CMT this past spring by doctors at Duke University Medical Center. Upon returning to school in August, Arbaugh began experiencing more severe symptoms of the disorder and, following another evaluation, was advised to retire to eliminate an increasing risk of leg and knee injuries. The inherited disorder, which affects 150,000 Americans, causes patients to slowly lose normal use of their feet/legs, and hands/arms as nerves to the extremities degenerate.

🔪 **ZEIGLER UP TO THE TASK...**When a foot disorder recently ended 6-foot-7, 255-pound sophomore center Darrell Arbaugh's collegiate basketball career, the Paladins' lost two inches and 45 pounds at the starting center position. Fortunately, though, Furman has experienced no production cuts on the court thus far as Arbaugh's replacement, sophomore Kenny Zeigler (Lithonia, Ga.) has stepped up by averaging 10.5 ppg and 5.8 rpg in six starts at center. Zeigler, who stands 6-foot-5 and weighs 210 pounds, came through in a big way in the Paladins' 69-59 win over Charleston Southern on Nov. 29, scoring 22 points and claiming 10 rebounds. In Monday's 79-74 overtime win over Florida State, he tossed in 10 points and garnered two assists, a block, and two steals. As a freshman a year ago Zeigler averaged 5.5 ppg and 4.4 rpg.

🔪 **FURMAN INKS PAIR IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD...**Furman head coach Larry Davis announced the signing of two recruits in November. Nick Sanders, a 6-foot-7 forward from Leavenworth, Kansas, and 6-foot-4 forward Jason Patterson from Lithonia, Ga., signed national letters of intent with the Paladins. Sanders, a three-year starter, all-conference, and all-state selection at Leavenworth High School, averaged 11.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg as a junior a year ago while helping his squad to a 23-2 record and 6A state championship -- the highest classification in Kansas. He scored a team high 16 points in Leavenworth's 59-56 win over Junction City in the state championship game. Working as his squad's sixth man as a junior, Patterson averaged 7.8 points and 5.8 rebounds per game as on a Lithonia High School team that posted a 24-7 record and finished as state AAA runner-up. This past summer he averaged 16.0 points in 12 AAU games with Team Carolina and the Atlanta Celtics. He was a high school teammate of Paladin sophomore center Kenny Zeigler at Lithonia.
