GENERAL: Experienced, three-year letterman who will join junior Guilherme Da Luz in providing Furman with proven playmaking ability at the point guard position...excellent ballhandler...has notched dramatic improvement in strength since his freshman year due to dedicated work in the weight room....boasts a strong understanding of the game...was the first player in his class to sign with the Paladins when he inked his national letter of intent in December of 1997.

AS A JUNIOR (2000-01): Registered playing time in all 26 games, almost exclusively as a backup to Guilherme Da Luz at point guard...lone start came at Georgia Southern (87-85 overtime loss)...averaged 12.8 minutes per game...logged a season high 23 minutes of action in a 70-62 win at Wofford...had a season high five assists in a 115-68 home season opening win over Atlanta Christian...scored season high five points at Bethune-Cookman (63-56 loss) and at Davidson (76-69 loss).

AS A SOPHOMORE (1999-00): Worked as a backup to starting point guard Guilherme Da Luz...logged playing time in all 32 games and averaged 13.5 minutes and 2.0 ppg...recorded 27 assists and committed only five turnovers over the Paladins' final 13 games...finished the season with 61 assists, 22 steals, and only 31 turnovers...assist total was second highest on team...tied a Furman school record with seven steals in a 125-53 home win over Southeastern...stepped up with solid play in Southern Conference Tournament action, totaling seven assists and a steal (and only two turnovers) in 22 minutes of action in the Paladins' 60-56 loss to Appalachian State in the semifinals...tallied a season high eight points and two assists in helping Furman snap a 15-game road losing streak with a 71-68 win over VMI.

AS A FRESHMAN (1998-99): Saw action in all 28 games working as the primary backup to Marcus Dilligard...averaged 17.4 minutes and 3.1 ppg...connected on 38.7 percent of his 3-point attempts (12x31) and shot a solid 70.5 percent from the free throw line (31x44)...converted a season high 8x13 free throws on the way to a season high 11 points in an

88-85 win over Charleston Southern in Greenville...registered 10 points and knocked down a pair of big 3-pointers in a 58-55 win over East Tennessee State in Johnson City...garnered a season high five assists at Northwestern (62-55 loss)...tallied six points with a pair of 3-pointers in a 92-70 win over Greensboro...collected a season high four steals against William & Mary (79-67 win) in Williamsburg.

HIGH SCHOOL: 1998 graduate of Wallace-Rose Hill High School...basketball coach was Steve Robinson...was the starting point guard on Wallace-Rose Hill's 31-0 state AA championship team...scored seven points and had 10 assists in Wallace-Rose Hill's 72-56 win over North Stanly in the state championship game...averaged 10.5 points and 8.5 assists per game and earned All-East Central Conference, all east regional tournament, and all-state honors as a senior...began his prep career at Southern Wayne High School in Dudley, N.C., where he was a starter in each of his first three seasons of play...twice earned All-Mideastern Conference honors after helping Southern Wayne to three straight league championships and a cumulative 60-20 record...attended Oak Hill (Va.) Academy at the start of his senior season but soon returned to North Carolina and enrolled at Wallace-Rose Hill.

GENERAL: Steady performer who returns for his final season as the Paladins' starting wing guard...has bounced back in good fashion and is expected to be 100 percent after undergoing arthroscopic surgery in early September to repair torn knee cartilage...ranks as Furman's top returning three-point shooter...sports a good knowledge of the game and a quick first step...likes to dribble penetrate and is proficient at getting the ball on the glass in quick fashion...has an excellent chance to join Karim Souchu in becoming the next two Furman players to reach the 1,000-point career scoring plateau...good student.

AS A JUNIOR (2000-01): Started at wing guard in 25 of Furman's 26 games and finished third on the team in scoring, averaging 11.1 ppg — one of four double figure scorers on team...led the Paladins and ranked eighth in the Southern Conference in three-point shooting (38.5 percent)...was also solid at the free throw line, where he shot 72.2 percent — the highest mark among Paladin starters...connected on 5-of-10 three-pointers as a part of a season high 18-point performance in a 79-74 overtime win at Florida State...also hit on 5-of-10 three-pointers on his way to 16 points in an 87-85 overtime loss at Georgia Southern.

AS A SOPHOMORE (1999-00): Earned starts at the wing guard position in 26 of Furman's 32 games and averaged 9.5 ppg and 3.4 rpg...converted 17x41 three-pointers (41.4 percent) over the final 10 games, helping Furman to a 6-4 record during that span...knocked down 5-of-7 three-point attempts as part of an 18-point performance in an 80-73 win over East Tennessee State in Greenville...recorded the finest game of his career in the Paladins' 77-61 win over UNC Greensboro in Southern Conference Tournament first round action, scoring 19 points and claiming eight rebounds and five steals...tallied a career high 20 points in a 125-53 triumph over Southeastern.

AS A FRESHMAN (1998-99): Fashioned a solid freshman season despite a pair of late season injuries...started at small forward in 22 of 25 games and averaging 6.5 ppg and 3.6 rpg...appeared to be on his way to strong Southern Conference All-Freshman Team consideration until suffering a concussion in the

final seconds of Furman's 58-55 win over East Tennessee State and a sprained knee two games later against Western Carolina...had averaged 10.3 ppg and 4.0 rpg in the six games prior to concussion...scored a season high 13 points (5x6 FTs) in an 81-68 loss to College of Charleston in Greenville...posted 10 points and a season high seven boards against Greensboro College (92-70 win).

HIGH SCHOOL: 1998 graduate of Woodward Academy...basketball coach was Tony Watkins...participated in the Georgia North-South and Georgia-Tennessee All-Star Games...averaged 21.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game in helping his squad to a 20-5 record and state playoff appearance his senior year...earned region player-of-the-year for the third straight season, All-Metro Atlanta, and *Atlanta Journal-Constitution* All-State second team honors...as junior garnered state AAA Player-of-the-Year, first team all-state, and All-Metro Atlanta honors after averaging 18.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in pacing Woodward Academy to a 27-2 record and appearance in state Final Four...squad was selected as the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Team-of-the-Year in 1997...shot 53.4 percent from the field, 73.4 percent from the line, and tallied 1,753 points, 573 rebounds, 202 steals, and 139 assists...Woodward Academy went 91-16 during his four-year tenure.

GENERAL: First name is pronounced GLEAR-may...talented performer who returns for his third season as Furman's starting point guard...considered by many to be the finest point guard to wear a Paladin uniform since Hal Henderson (1989-92)...in addition to holding Furman single game assist record (14) and sharing season assist mark (159), already ranks sixth on school career assists chart (313)...with 89 career steals, is in position to also move onto Furman's career thefts ledger this season along with teammate Karim Souchu...with another strong season should contend for All-Southern Conference honors...possesses excellent basketball skills...sports proven ability to score off dribble penetration and from three-point range...can also be used effectively in post-up situations against smaller guards...good defender, solid rebounder, and strong floor leader...also a good free throw shooter.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2000-01): Followed up an impressive freshman campaign with a strong second season, starting in 25 of Furman's 26 games and averaging 11.2 ppg and 5.9 apg...assist/game mark was the highest season average in Furman basketball history and ranked second in Southern Conference...also averaged an impressive 4.9 rpg — the third highest mark on team...registered a season high 10 assists and scored 16 points in 85-66 win over Stetson...had nine dishes in four games...scored a season high 23 points (9x10 FTs) and collected nine rebounds and seven assists in a career high 43 minutes of action against Chattanooga (73-71 overtime win)...recorded career 11 boards in two contests...poured in 17 points (9x11 FTs) and had seven assists and a season high five steals in 79-74 overtime win at Florida State...came within striking distance of a triple double with an 10-point, 11-rebound, 7-assist performance against Western Carolina (67-47 win)...captured Furman's Frank Selvy MVP, Academic, and Play Hard Awards following season.

AS A FRESHMAN (1999-00): Put together a strong first season as a Paladin, winning the starting point guard job in the pre-season and earning the starting nod in all 32 games...broke Dave Conrady's single

game assist record (13) with 14 assists (and 10 points) in 97-75 triumph over Coastal Carolina in Greenville...tied Bill Harder's Furman single season assist record with 159 dishes, the most by any Southern Conference freshman in 1999-00...had a pair of 9-assist outings against Davidson in Greenville (74-63 loss) and East Tennessee State in Greenville (80-73 win)...4.97 apg average ranked fifth among league point guards...also averaged 8.8 ppg and collected 50 steals...steals mark was second highest on team and fifth highest season total in school history...posted a school single game record tying seven thefts in his first game — a 125-53 rout of Southeastern...registered 10 double figure scoring performances, including a season high 26-point effort in a 72-63 loss to Chattanooga in Chattanooga...tallied 23 points in a 75-68 loss to South Carolina in Columbia...scored 15 points and had eight assists in a 77-61 thumping of UNC Greensboro in Southern Conference Tournament first round action...came back the following day with an 11-point, 6-assist effort in a 68-54 triumph over Georgia Southern...garnered a season high 10 rebounds in a 73-55 win over Wofford.

GENERAL: Last name is pronounced SUE-shoe...skillful, silky smooth forward who is considered by many to be one of the most talented players to wear a Paladin uniform in the last several seasons...ranks as one of the top players in the Southern Conference...with improved team success, could be considered for league player-of-the-year honors...overall game presents Furman with excellent versatility and opponents with matchup problems...can score from the perimeter and off the dribble against similar sized and bigger defenders and can also exploit opponents inside in post-up situations...good rebounder and excellent leaper with an explosive first step...is a classic "go-to" player late in a possession due to his ability to create a quality shot...has ability to be a solid defender...heads into the season needing 50 points to become only the 33rd player in Furman history to score 1,000 points...with 95 steals, is also poised to move onto Furman's career thefts chart this season.

ASA SOPHOMORE (2000-01): Consensus All-Southern Conference first team pick by head coaches and media...finished second in the league in scoring, averaging 18.9 ppg...season scoring average was the highest by a Furman player since Mel Daniel averaged 22.0 ppg in 1980-81...also led Furman in steals (43)...topped the 20-point plateau in 12 games, including a career high 28 in an 87-85 overtime loss at Georgia Southern...converted 5x7 three-point field goals on the way to 27 points in a 76-69 loss at Davidson...powered Furman to a 79-74 overtime win at Florida State with a 24-point, 7-rebound performance...pulled down a season high 12 rebounds and scored 17 points against Vanderbilt (78-64 loss) in Nashville...keyed a 67-47 win over Western Carolina in Greenville by scoring 20 points and tallying a season high five assists and six steals...had 17 points, 11 rebounds, and five steals in a victory over Stetson in Greenville...topped the 20-point mark in 11 games and scored in double figures in all but two games...was Furman's leading scorer in 23 of its 26 games..

AS A FRESHMAN (1999-00): Third team All-Southern Conference selection by league media and first

team league tournament pick...finished as runner-up in balloting for conference freshman-of-the-year honors...led Furman in scoring (15.8 ppg), rebounding (7.4 rpg), field goal percentage (54.1%), and steals (52)...ranked sixth in the league in scoring, ninth in rebounding, and eighth in field goal percentage...52 steals ranked as the third highest season total in school history...sat out the first three games of the season due to three-game participation with a French professional team prior to his signing with Furman...paced Furman in scoring 16 times and topped the Paladins in rebounding in 15 games...was twice named conference freshman-of-the-week...tallied double figure scoring performances in 28 contests, including a season high 27-point performance in a 71-68 win over VMI in Lexington that snapped a 15-game road losing skid...registered 24 points and nine rebounds against Coastal Carolina in Greenville (97-75 win)...other top game included a 20-point, 8-rebound outing in a 68-65 win over Old Dominion in the SoCon Holiday Hoops Tournament.

HIGH SCHOOL: 1997 graduate of Dijon School...helped lead his youth squad to a 32-7 record and played on French Junior National Team.

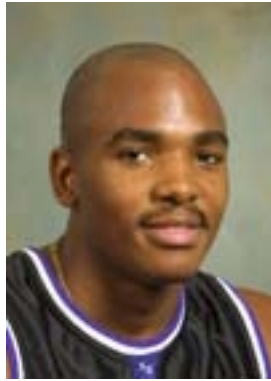

GENERAL: Two-year letterman who ranks as Furman's most experienced inside player...will be counted on heavily again as the veteran in a Paladin frontcourt made up of mostly younger, less experienced performers...lacks the bulk and height of most opponents, but is strong for size and possesses excellent leaping ability and quickness, which he uses effectively on both sides of the court...possesses the team's top shot blocking instincts...can score effectively out to 16 feet with the jump shot and also on the drive...ranks as perhaps Furman's most improved players over the last two seasons...very hard...highly respected by coaches and teammates...joined by freshman guard Jason Patterson as one of two Lithonia (Ga.) High School products now in Furman program.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2000-01): Stepped into the starting lineup after returning regular Darrell Arbaugh was forced to give up the game due to a progressive neuromuscular foot disorder...was the only Paladin to start in all 26 games...averaged 10.2 ppg and a team leading 7.5 rpg...rebounding figure ranked fifth in Southern Conference...was one of four Paladins to average in double figures in scoring...shot a team best 53.8 percent from the field — also the fifth best percentage in the conference...tallied a season high 22 points (8x9 FGs) and 10 rebounds in 69-59 win over Charleston Southern in Greenville...had 18 points and career high 15 rebounds in 83-72 loss to Georgia Southern in Greenville...registered 15 points (7x8 FTs) and 12 boards in 70-62 triumph over Wofford in Spartanburg...had 14 points, seven rebounds, and career high five blocks in 67-47 victory over Western Carolina in Greenville...in all tallied 13 double figure scoring performances and eight double digit rebounding efforts...shared Furman's Most Improved Award with Marijan Pojatina following season.

AS A FRESHMAN (1999-00): Saw action in 31 of the Paladins' 32 games and earned starts in the season's first three contests at power forward during Karim Souchu's absence...averaged 5.5 ppg and 4.4 rpg...led Furman in blocks with 18...scored a career high 24 points and claimed 11 rebounds in his first collegiate

game, a 125-53 win over Southeastern...registered 12 points and a season high three blocks against Georgia Southern (89-77 loss) in Statesboro...also had 12 points against Chattanooga (72-63 loss) in Chattanooga...claimed a season high 12 boards in a 56-51 loss to College of Charleston in Greenville...tallied 10 points and seven boards in an 80-73 triumph over Georgia Southern in Greenville...connected on a key 3-pointer that helped smother a rally by Georgia Southern in the Paladins' 68-54 win over the Eagles in Southern Conference Tournament quarterfinal action.

HIGH SCHOOL: 1999 graduate of Lithonia High School...basketball coach was Eric Mance...played both forward slots and the post position during his prep career...earned all-state and Atlanta Journal-Constitution DeKalb County Player-of-the-Year honors as a senior after averaging a county best 21.0 ppg and 9.1 rpg...helped Lithonia post a 27-4 record, region 6-AAA championship, and No. 5 ranking in Georgia in 1999...was selected to play in the Georgia North-South All-Star Game and Georgia-Tennessee All-Star game...scored 29 points and claimed 16 rebounds in helping Lithonia to the Las Vegas Holiday Tournament championship his junior year...named Lithonia Senior Class Male-of-the-Year.

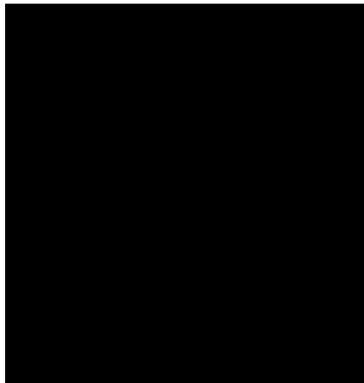
