**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Furman travels to Johnson City, Tenn., for a 4:30 p.m. game at the Memorial Center against the 8-8, 8-3 Bucs of East Tennessee State. The Furman record is at odds with itself over this game -- the Lady Paladins are 4-0 this season on Mondays, but only 2-6 in games played before 5:00 p.m.

**SERIES RECORD:** Tonight's meeting is the 50th game in the Furman-ETSU series. The Lady Paladins own a 35-14 all-time record against the Bucs, with a 17-7 advantage in Greenville and a 12-6 lead in Johnson City. Furman also has a 6-1 advantage when playing ETSU in the Southern Conference Tournament. Earlier this season the Lady Paladins recorded an 83-58 victory over ETSU, at home in Timmons Arena.

**SCOUTING THE BUCS:** The Bucs enter today's game with Furman riding a three-game win streak that includes victories over Wofford, Appalachian State, and Western Carolina. Tiffani Mayes is leading the ETSU squad with a 14.3 points and 9.3 rebounds per game average, while Kiya Verdell is adding 10.9 points per game. Brooke Wilhoit is the Bucs' top playmaker, with 52 assists to her credit so far this season. Verdell tops ETSU's steals list, with 34. As a team, ETSU is making 39.6% of its field goals with a 28.6% mark from three-point range. The Bucs are collecting 39.9 rebounds per game and scoring 62.4 points on average. In the Bucs most recent game against Wofford, Mayes poured in 21 points and claimed 15 rebounds, while B.J. Banjo added 17 points and Lauren Trantham contributed 16.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Furman's Orion Wake scored 13 and grabbed 12 rebounds, but Furman fell 65-58 to the league-leading Mocs of Chattanooga. With the game tied at 47 late in the second half, UTC's Katasha Brown hit three consecutive three-pointers to put the game out of reach for Furman. In addition to Wake's double-double, Deshara Shealey scored 11 and Jen Nadalin added 10. The game was the first of three on the road for the Lady Paladins.

**CHANGES COMING ON:** Furman has posted victories in five of its last seven games. Compared to the first 10 games, in which the Lady Paladins posted a 4-6 record, Furman is shooting three-pointers better (.298 to .312), rebounding better (42.9 to 43.9), and turning the ball over less (22.5 to 17.4). The most startling number has to do with the Lady Paladin defense, however, which gave up 66.7 points per game in the first 10 contests, and has given up a stingy 51.7 per game in the last seven.

**MOVING ON UP:** Senior center Orion Wake has recorded a double-double in five of the last eight games, and with 12 rebounds against UTC entered the Lady Paladin top five. Wake totals 735 rebounds entering the game with ETSU, which ranks fifth on the Lady Paladins' all-time chart, and is 56 boards away from Rhonda Chanson's fourth place total of 791. Natalie Cleckley ('91) holds the Lady Paladin record for career rebounds, with 1,102.

**THE GOOD, THE BAD, THE UGLY:** While Furman leads the Southern Conference statistics in steals (11.69), offensive rebounds (17.00), and rebounding defense (35.9), the Lady Paladins are a dismal sixth in three-point percentage (.307), ninth in three-pointers made (3.62), eighth in assist/turnover ratio (0.60), and 10th in free throw percentage (.638).

**FOCUSING ON 1,000:** Senior forward Kim Lawrence scored eight points in the Lady Paladin game against Western Carolina to become the 15th woman in school history to score 1,000 points in her career. Lawrence entered the game with the Catamounts seven points away from 1,000 and earned the coveted mark on a jump shot with 6:00 left in the game.

**LINEUP SHAKEDOWN:** After starting the same five players the first 10 games of the year, coach Sam Dixon made a slight alteration entering the Wofford game and has five victories in seven games with the new lineup. In these games Deshara Shealey and Jen Nadalin have been replaced in the starting block by Lauren Few and Katie Roach. Not only have Few and Roach risen to the challenge, but Shealey and Nadalin have given the team a great punch off the bench.

**PRESSURE, PRESSURE:** Furman full-court press and ball harrassment has forced every single opponent this season 15 or more turnovers. Holy Cross has the most, with 31, while UTC had the fewest, with 15. When Furman takes care of the ball and commits less than 15 turnovers, the Lady Paladins are 2-1.

**TENACIOUS D:** The Lady Paladins are giving up just 60.5 (second in the SoCon) points per game to their opponents this season. Entering today's game against ETSU, the Lady Paladins are 7-2 when allowing 60 or fewer points - Furman's only missteps in this situation were a 58-48 loss to the Big East's Providence in the season opener and a 57-46 loss at Davidson.

**PROPHETIC FIRST HALF:** So far this season the Lady Paladins have not staged any big comebacks, but they haven't had any serious second half tanks either. In fact, Furman is 7-1 when leading at the half and 0-6 when trailing at the half. In the three games that have been tied at the break the Lady Paladins are 2-1 with the lone loss to Clemson.

**BLOWOUTS ONLY, PLEASE:** The Lady Paladins are a surprising 0-5 in games decided by 10 points or less. In games with a margin of 11 or more points, the Lady Paladin record improves to 9-3.

**TRUTH IN NUMBERS:** With a 9-8 record this season Furman's statistics in games won are easy to compare to stats in games lost. Here is a look at how the Lady Paladins look in a few major categories:

**MORE ABOUT FURMAN VS. FURMAN:** In games won this season senior Kim Lawrence is Furman's most productive offensive player, averaging 10.9 points per game. Deshara Shealey comes in second at 9.9, with Tommi Paris a close third at 9.6. In games lost Lawrence ranks fourth, at 7.4, while Shealey is tops at 11.1 and Paris is second at 9.9. In addition, Furman is outscoring opponents in the second half 337-266 in victories, and have been outscored 291-243 in the second period in losses.

**SHOOTING HELPS, BUT NOT A MUST:** While every team would like to shoot 50% or better from the field in every game of the season, Furman has yet to accomplish this feat a single time in 16 games. The good news is the Lady Paladins are 6-4 when shooting between 40-49% from the field and have even won three games (3-4) when shooting less than 40%.

**MONDAY, MONDAY:** Some teams may have manic Mondays, but the Lady Paladins seem to enjoy the first day of the work week. In fact, Furman is a perfect 4-0 on Monday, in contrast to a dismal 0-2 when playing on Sunday. Along the same lines, the Lady Paladins are a solid 7-2 in night games (starting at or after 5 p.m.), but only 2-6 in games played earlier in the day.

**SETTING THE STANDARD:** Senior center Orion Wake is at the top of the Southern Conference statistics in two categories this season. Wake paces the conference in rebounds (9.1) and offensive rebounds (3.44), and is second in defensive boards (5.69). In addition, Kim Lawrence leads the league in steals at 2.56 per game. The Furman team as a whole also leads the league in steals (11.69), turnover margin (+1.62), offensive rebounds (16.71), rebounding margin (+7.9) and rebounding defense (35.9).

**BENCH BRIEFS:** In the season opener at Providence, the Furman bench was led by sophomore Mivvi Strickland, who contributed six of 13 points scored by the Lady Paladin non-starters. By contrast, in game two the Furman bench contributed 43 of the Lady Paladins' 77 points. The Lady Paladins are currently 8-1 when the bench scores more than 20, while the record falls to 1-7 with a bench total less of 20 or less.

**SECOND HALF SLUMP:** In 17 games this season the Lady Paladins have been outscored in the second half nine times (1-8). Furman was outscored by six versus Providence, two by ETSU, eight by Clemson, 14 by Georgia, one by Chattanooga, four by Virginia Tech, two by UNC Greensboro, nine by Davidson, and four by UTC. However, the Lady Paladins have turned the tide and have outscored six of the last nine opponents (Holy Cross, Wofford, WCU, ASU, C of C, and GSU) in the second half.

**HEAD COACH SAM DIXON:** Furman coach Sam Dixon, a 1979 graduate of College of Wooster, is in his second season at the helm of the Lady Paladin program. In his first year as Furman head coach the Lady Paladins posted a 16-13 overall record with an 11-7, fourth place finish in the Southern Conference, despite a roster laden with four freshman, four sophomores, and no seniors. In addition, guard Deshara Shealey was the league's Player of the Year after averaging 14.9 points, 5.3 rebounds, and 3.83 assists per game. Prior to taking the head coaching position at Furman, Dixon was associate coach at Clemson (1999-02) and assistant coach at Arizona (1998-99).

**WARMING UP:** Orion Wake's 12-point performance against the Hokies of Virginia Tech was the senior center's first double digit scoring performance since scoring 10 on March 1, 2002. Wake followed up her 12 versus Virginia Tech with 10 points and 15 rebounds against the Spartans of UNC Greensboro, 12 points and 13 rebounds versus the Terriers of Wofford, and 10 points 11 rebounds against the WCU Catamounts -- giving her three consecutive double-doubles. Wake's double-double streak was broken against Appalachian State, but she doubled up again with 13 points, 10 rebounds against the College of Charleston and 13 points, 12 rebounds versus UTC.

**NINE WITH 10:** Though only Deshara Shealey (10.5) is averaging in double figure scoring for Furman, nine Lady Paladins have scored in double digits this year. In fact, Shealey and Tommi Paris have each scored 20-plus points once this season, while Kim Lawrence and Laney Harris have scored 15, Mivvi Strickland and Katie Roach have totaled 14, Lauren Few has totaled 13, and Jen Nadalin and Orion Wake have managed 12.

**MOP UP CREW:** Furman has outrebounded 11 of 17 opponents this season and had an equal number of boards in the Clemson and UTC games. The Lady Paladin rebounding corps is led by Orion Wake, who is averaging 9.1 rebounds per game, has a team-high 59 offensive rebounds so far this season, and has led Furman on the boards in 12 games this year. Wake ranks first in the Southern Conference in both rebounds and offensive rebounds. The three teams that have outrebounded Furman are Georgia (#9), Virginia Tech (#15), and Holy Cross by a grand total of 15 (exactly five in each game).

**SHEALEY SETS MARK:** With two assists versus Appalachian State, Furman senior Deshara Shealey became just the second woman in school history to record 1,000 points, 400 rebounds, and 300 assists. Only Janice Rhynehardt, a two-time All-Conference guard who played from 1989-92, has completed this feat in the past. Rhynehardt completed her career with 1,676 points, 449 rebounds and 327 assists.

**LANEY LEADS THE WAY:** Junior forward Laney Harris knocked down five three pointers in Furman's game against the Bulldogs of Gardner-Webb, four in the Lady Paladin win over Western Carolina, and two versus Appalachian State. So far this season, Furman is 3-0 when Harris hits at least two three-pointers.

**MIVVI MAKES HER MARK:** Sophomore forward Mivvi Strickland, a transfer from the University of Alabama, stormed off the bench in Furman's 77-58 win over Gardner-Webb to make five-of-eight field goals and four-of-eight free throws for 14 points. In addition, Strickland dished off two assists and claimed three steals.

**FURMAN IN SEASON OPENERS:** Through the years, season openers have not been easy on the Lady Paladins, a team that has traditionally played a very tough non-conference season. Furman holds an all-time record of 13-22 in game ones, though Sam Dixon bucked that trend when he led the Lady Paladins to a 100-59 season-opening victory over Oglethorpe last year. In addition to Providence this season, the Lady Paladins of the past have inaugurated new seasons by playing South Carolina, Miami, Clemson, Alabama and Georgia, among others.

**NO PLACE LIKE HOME:** Furman owns a 54-20 (.730) record within the friendly confines of Timmons Arena - the Lady Paladin home since 1997. In 1999-00 and 2000-01, the Lady Paladins won 10 games at home in Timmons and on December 2, 2001, recorded an historic 59-57 victory over intrastate rival Clemson of the ACC.

**CONFERENCE ROULETTE:** Furman's Lady Paladin basketball team has played squads from seven different conferences this season. Furman played both Providence and Virginia Tech from the Big East. Opponent Gardner-Webb hails from the Atlantic Sun, while Clemson is a long-time ACC member. The Lander Bearcats play in the Peach Belt Conference, while Georgia is annual contender for the Southeastern Conference Title. Finally, the Crusaders of Holy Cross represent the Patriot League. The rest of Furman's opponents compete in the Southern Conference - the league Furman has been a member of since 1936.

**PRESEASON POLL:** The Southern Conference preseason coaches' poll is in, and the Lady Paladins were picked to finish second in the league behind defending champion Chattanooga. Furman collected 85 points to Chattanooga's 99, and received one first-place vote. The poll played out as follows:

**SHEALEY AS A SENIOR:** Reigning 2003 Southern Conference Player of the Year Deshara Shealey is back for her senior season with the Lady Paladins. Already chosen as the league's preseason Player of the Year for 2004, Shealey is a big play maker with good passing skills, outstanding athleticism and a great work ethic. Shealey's career highs include 33 points versus Ohio (11-21-01), 13 rebounds against the College of Charleston (1-22-02), seven assists on four occasions and four steals on seven occasions. Last year Shealey hit a shot against Virginia with .3 seconds on the clock, giving the Lady Paladins a 58-56 road victory over the Cavaliers.

**WAKE UP CALL:** Furman senior Orion Wake is back after redshirting during the 2002-03 season. Wake, a 6-2 center from Woodbridge, Va., played in all 29 games during the 2001-02 season, averaging 10.6 points and 9.0 rebounds. A first-team all-conference selection that year, Wake was also named Southern Conference Player of the Week on Jan. 15, 2002, after averaging 17.3 points and 12.0 rebounds in games the previous week. Wake enters the 2003-04 season with career highs of 26 points at Georgia Southern (1-14-02), 14 rebounds versus ETSU (3-4-00) and Appalachian State (2-2-02), and three steals and three blocks.

**KIMPOSSIBLE:** With senior forward Kim Lawrence, a 5-11, three-year letterwinner for the Lady Paladins, anything is possible. Lawrence was the recipient of the team's Best Defensive Player Award last year, but don't think her offensive skills are lacking. In fact, Lawrence scored 29 versus Charleston Southern last year (11-29-02) and has a career free throw percentage of .778 (136-175). In addition she claimed eight steals versus Appalachian State last season (2-3-03) and had three blocks in her 29-point game against CSU. Indeed, Lawrence is an all-around player who brings balance, experience, and skill to the Lady Paladin lineup.

**LADY PALADIN LINEAGE:** The Lady Paladin varsity basketball team played its first season of competition in 1969-70, posting an 8-2 record under head coach Virginia Robertson. In 34 years of competition, the Furman women's basketball program has posted a 385-407 record with 15 winning seasons, and a 13-21 record in season openers. During these years Furman women's basketball players have earned 29 all-conference citations (coaches), five SoCon Freshman of the Year Awards, five SoCon Player of the Year plaques, and one Freshman All-America award. In addition, the Lady Paladins have won four Southern Conference Championships, two league tournament titles, and earned two bids to the NCAA Tournament (1995 and 2000).
