TODAY'S GAME: Today's game pits the 3-4 Lady Paladins against the 15th-ranked, 8-0 Hokies of Virginia Tech. It is the second of the season for Furman against a Big East opponent (Providence) and against a top 25 team (#9, Georgia), but is the first game of the 2003 Lady Luck Classic, which features Holy Cross and Wake Forest in addition to Va. Tech and Furman.

SERIES RECORD: Today's meeting is the second between Furman and Virginia Tech, though it is the Lady Paladins' third trip to the Lady Luck Classic. The Hokies lead the series 1-0 after a 73-61 victory over Furman in the 1994 tournament. In '94, the Lady Paladins went 0-2 in the Diamond Club Classic, but in 1997 followed a 92-85 loss to Siena with a 77-53 victory over Maryland-Baltimore County.

SCOUTING THE HOKIES: The Hokies of Virginia Tech enter today's game riding an eight game win streak and ranked 15th in the nation by USA Today. Tech's victories list includes wins over the SEC's Mississippi State and Alabama and the ACC's Virginia and Maryland. The Hokies' Erin Gibson is shooting 53.6% from the field and is averaging 12.0 points and 8.6 rebounds per game, while Ieva Kublina is at 13.4 points and 7.6 boards per game. Though Kublina has connected on six three-pointers this season, Carrie Mason's is tops on the team from beyond the arc (.355, 11-for-31), while Kirby Copeland has connected on 10 treys so far this season.

LAST TIME OUT: Chattanooga's Katasha Brown and Tiffani Roberson combined to score 46 of the Lady Mocs' point in a 70-65 victory over Furman. The Lady Paladins were led by Deshara Shealey, who scored 16, Tommi Paris' 12, and Katie Roach's 10. The teams were even on the boards, with each grabbing 38 rebounds, while the Mocs outblasted Furman from beyond the arc, hitting seven three pointers to the Lady Paladins' three.

HEAD COACH SAM DIXON: Furman coach Sam Dixon, a 1979 graduate of College of Wooster, is in his second season at the helm of the Lady Paladin program. In his first year as Furman head coach the Lady Paladins posted a 16-13 overall record with an 11-7, fourth place finish in the Southern Conference, despite a roster laden with four freshman, four sophomores, and no seniors. In addition, guard Deshara Shealey was the league's Player of the Year after averaging 14.9 points, 5.3 rebounds, and 3.83 assists per game. Prior to taking the head coaching position at Furman, Dixon was associate coach at Clemson (1999-02) and assistant coach at Arizona (1998-99).

TOWING THE LINE: Senior Deshara Shealey is the reigning Southern Conference Player of the Year and is bearing the lion's share of the Lady Paladins' offensive responsibilities. In fact, this season Shealey has attempted 104 field goals -- 46 more than Tommi Paris, who ranks second on the squad.

LUCKY NUMBER SEVEN: Though only Deshara Shealey (14.1) and Tommi Paris (10.1) are averaging in double figure scoring for Furman, seven Lady Paladins have scored in double digits this year. In fact, Shealey and Tommi Paris have each scored 20-plus points once this season, while Kim Lawrence and Laney Harris have scored 15, Mivvi Strickland has totaled 14, Jen Nadalin has managed 12, and Katie Roach has scored 10.

NEEDING SOME CHARITY: Though Furman has shot 192 free throws to its opponent's 133 this year, Furman has only connected on 62.5% (120) of those freebies. In fact, only Katie Roach (21-27, .778) is shooting better than 70%. Even Tommi Paris, who connected on 86.2% of her free throws last season, has made only 64.3% (18-of-28) of her shots from the charity stripe this season.

SECOND HALF SLUMP: Thought Furman has outscored its opponents 239-200 in the first period this season, the Lady Paladins have been outscored 263-234 in the second period. In fact, in seven games this season the Lady Paladins have been outscored in the second half five times. Furman was outscored by six versus Providence, two by ETSU, eight by Clemson, 14 by Georgia, and one by Chattanooga. The Lady Paladins' lone second half advantage came against Gardner-Webb, when the Lady Paladins outscored the Bulldogs 40-39 in the second period. Furman and Lander played even in the second period with each team scoring 46.

MOP UP CREW: Furman has outrebounded four of seven opponents this season and had an equal number of boards in the Clemson and UTC games. The Lady Paladin rebounding corps is led by Orion Wake, who is averaging 8.7 rebounds per game and has a team-high 24 offensive rebounds so far this season. Wake ranks second in the Southern Conference in rebounding behind ETSU's Lauren Trantham.

TAKING IT TO THE HOOP: The Lady Paladins had little trouble taking the ball to the hoop in the Dec. 1 game against East Tennessee State. In fact, the Lady Paladins scored 32 points in the paint, including 20 in the first half alone. That partially explains the Lady Paladins' .513 shooting percentage from the field in the game's first period.

PRESSING MATTERS: Furman's press was up and running against the Bucs of ETSU. The Lady Paladins forced 28 ETSU turnovers in the Dec. 1 game, including 20 in the first period. Furman also did its best job so far this season of controlling the ball, committing 18 turnovers while claiming 16 steals.

SHEALEY CLOSING IN: Furman senior Deshara Shealey enters today's game against Virginia Tech having reached the 1,000 career points milestone with a 21-point effort against Lander. In addition, with 15 more assists, Shealey will be just the second woman in school history to record 1,000 points, 400 rebounds, and 300 assists. Only Janice Rhynehardt, a two-time All-Conference guard who played from 1989-92, has completed this feat in the past. Rhynehardt completed her career with 1,676 points, 449 rebounds and 327 assists.

SURE SHOT LAWRENCE: Senior Kim Lawrence has scored in double figures in four of the last five games, and is first on the team with a .491 (28-57) field goal percentage. Lawrence ranks second in the league in field goal percentage behind the Moc's Katasha Brown.

LANEY LEADS THE WAY: Junior forward Laney Harris knocked down five three pointers in Furman's game against the Bulldogs of Gardner-Webb. Harris, who was five-for-nine on the night also claimed four rebounds and dished off five assists in 22 minutes of action. Harris currently leads the Lady Paladins with 10 three-pointers on the year.

MIVVI MAKES HER MARK: Sophomore forward Mivvi Strickland, a transfer from the University of Alabama, stormed off the bench in Furman's 77-58 win over Gardner-Webb to make five-of-eight field goals and four-of-eight free throws for 14 points. In addition, Strickland dished off two assists and claimed three steals.

FURMAN IN SEASON OPENERS: Through the years, season openers have not been easy on the Lady Paladins, a team that has traditionally played a very tough non-conference season. Furman holds an all-time record of 13-22 in game ones, though Sam Dixon bucked that trend when he led the Lady Paladins to a 100-59 season-opening victory over Oglethorpe last year. In addition to Providence this season, the Lady Paladins of the past have inaugurated new seasons by playing South Carolina, Miami, Clemson, Alabama and Georgia, among others.

BENCH BRIEFS: In the season opener at Providence, the Furman bench was led by sophomore Mivvi Strickland, who contributed six of 13 points scored by the Lady Paladin non-starters. By contrast, in game two the Furman bench contributed 43 of the Lady Paladins' 77 points. Laney Harris paced the bench and the team with 15 points, while Strickland added 14 and Katie Roach contributed 10. The Lady Paladins are currently 2-0 when the bench scores 20 or more, while the record fall to 1-4 with a bench total less than 20.

REBOUNDING RATIOS: Furman has won the rebounding battle in four of seven game this season, and tied both Clemson and Chattanooga with 40 and 38, respectively. The Lady Paladins outrebounded Providence by five, but were hampered by a .261 second half shooting percentage. Versus the Lady Bulldogs of Gardner-Webb, the Lady Paladins posted a significant 20 rebound advantage in the game and went on to claim a 77-58 victory, and in the 83-58 win over ETSU, Furman outrebounded the Bucs 44-38. In the game against Lander Furman recorded a 55-37 advantage on the boards.

PRESEASON POLL: The Southern Conference preseason coaches' poll is in, and the Lady Paladins were picked to finish second in the league behind defending champion Chattanooga. Furman collected 85 points to Chattanooga's 99, and received one first-place vote. The poll played out as follows:

CONFERENCE ROULETTE: Furman's Lady Paladin basketball team could play squads from seven different conferences - and all before the new year. In addition to Providence, the Lady Paladins will face the Big East's Virginia Tech in the Dec. 28-29 Lady Luck Classic. Opponent Gardner-Webb hails from the Atlantic Sun, while Clemson is a long-time ACC member. The Lander Bearcats play in the Peach Belt Conference, while Georgia is annual contender for the Southeastern Conference Title. Finally, the Crusaders of Holy Cross represent the Patriot League and could be a second round Furman opponent in the Lady Luck Classic at Virginia Tech. The rest of Furman's opponents compete in the Southern Conference - the league Furman has been a member of since 1936.

SHEALEY AS A SENIOR: Reigning 2003 Southern Conference Player of the Year Deshara Shealey is back for her senior season with the Lady Paladins. Already chosen as the league's preseason Player of the Year for 2004, Shealey is a big play maker with good passing skills, outstanding athleticism and a great work ethic. Shealey's career highs include 33 points versus Ohio (11-21-01), 13 rebounds against the College of Charleston (1-22-02), seven assists on four occasions and four steals on seven occasions. Last year Shealey hit a shot against Virginia with .3 seconds on the clock, giving the Lady Paladins a 58-56 road victory over the Cavaliers.

WAKE UP CALL: Furman senior Orion Wake is back after redshirting during the 2002-03 season. Wake, a 6-2 center from Woodbridge, Va., played in all 29 games during the 2001-02 season, averaging 10.6 points and 9.0 rebounds. A first-team all-conference selection that year, Wake was also named Southern Conference Player of the Week on Jan. 15, 2002, after averaging 17.3 points and 12.0 rebounds in games the previous week. Wake enters the 2003-04 season with career highs of 26 points at Georgia Southern (1-14-02), 14 rebounds versus ETSU (3-4-00) and Appalachian State (2-2-02), and three steals and three blocks.

KIMPOSSIBLE: With senior forward Kim Lawrence, a 5-11, three-year letterwinner for the Lady Paladins, anything is possible. Lawrence was the recipient of the team's Best Defensive Player Award last year, but don't think her offensive skills are lacking. In fact, Lawrence scored 29 versus Charleston Southern last year (11-29-02) and has a career free throw percentage of .778 (136-175). In addition she claimed eight steals versus Appalachian State last season (2-3-03) and had three blocks in her 29-point game against CSU. Indeed, Lawrence is an all-around player who brings balance, experience, and skill to the Lady Paladin lineup.

FURMAN IN THE PRESEASON: The Lady Paladin basketball team played a preseason game on Nov. 13 versus the Patriots of Francis Marion. Furman outrebounded the Patriots 55-39 en route to a 74-53 victory. Katie Roach led all Furman scorers with 16 points and 10 rebounds, while Deshara Shealey added 14 points, Tommi Paris contributed 11, and Jen Nadalin chipped in 10. Orion Wake also featured prominently, with a team-high 11 rebounds and eight points. Senior forward Kim Lawrence was held scoreless, but dished off a team-best five assists and claimed four steals.

SHINING SENIORS: Furman's 2004 senior class is one of the strongest in the history of the Lady Paladin program. Last year alone, Shealey and Lawrence combined to score 39% of the Lady Paladins points, and were also responsible for 30% of the rebounds. The year before, Lawrence, Shealey, and Wake were good for 46% of points and 49% of rebounds. In addition, in the last three years, Furman has posted a 52-35 overall record with a 34-20 mark in the Southern Conference.

LADY PALADIN LINEAGE: The Lady Paladin varsity basketball team played its first season of competition in 1969-70, posting an 8-2 record under head coach Virginia Robertson. In 34 years of competition, the Furman women's basketball program has posted a 385-407 record with 15 winning seasons, and a 13-21 record in season openers. During these years Furman women's basketball players have earned 29 all-conference citations (coaches), five SoCon Freshman of the Year Awards, five SoCon Player of the Year plaques, and one Freshman All-America award. In addition, the Lady Paladins have won four Southern Conference Championships, two league tournament titles, and earned two bids to the NCAA Tournament (1995 and 2000).

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Furman owns a 51-20 (.718) record within the friendly confines of Timmons Arena - the Lady Paladin home since 1997. In 1999-00 and 2000-01, the Lady Paladins won 10 games at home in Timmons and on December 2, 2001, recorded an historic 59-57 victory over intrastate rival Clemson of the ACC.
