Noting the Lady Paladins

- A CAREER DAY... Furman junior and current Southern Conference Player of the Year Jackie Smith tied the school record for points in a game versus Middle Tennessee State with 37. Smith was 10-for-16 overall, two-for-two from three point range, and 15-for-18 from the line. In addition, she claimed a team-high 16 rebounds for the 23rd double-double of her career.
- •2-27-97... The last time Furman and ETSU met was in the first round of the Southern Conference Tournament at UNC Greensboro. The Lady Paladins earned an 85-74 victory by shooting 55.2% fromt the field, 42.9% from three points range, and outrebounding the athletic Bucs by one. In addition, Furman recorded four blocks and were led on the night by SoCon Player of the Year Jackie Smith, who poured in 17 points and claimed 11 rebounds. Shawn Thompson led the ETSU effort with 16 points.
- •LAST GAME... Furman picked up its first win of the 1998-99 season on Tuesday, December 1, with a 73-55 decision over the Cougars of College of Charleston. Furman sophomore Amy King led the Lady Paladins on the night with 12 points, while Jackie Smith and Kena Hodges shared rebounding honors with seven each. The victory put Furman at the top of the Southern Conference standings with a perfect 1-0 league record.
- •TOUGH START... Furman may have started the season 0-4, but all four opponents were in the NCAA's Big Dance a year ago. In addition, Clemson is currently ranked 25th by the Associated Press and 24th in the USA Today/ESPN Top 25, while Colorado State is rated 12th in AP and 15th by USA Today.
- **GETTING A HANDLE...** If the Lady Paladins are going to be successful this season, they have got to take better care of the ball. Furman has recorded 108 turnovers already this season, for a 21.6 per game average. The Lady Paladins coughed up the rock a season-high 30 times versus Wisconsin-Milwaukee and lost by 20 after trailing by just two at halftime.
- BACK ON THE BENCH... After spending the summer as a guard for the WNBA's Washington Mystics, Furman assistant coach Adrienne Shuler is back on the bench. Don't expect her to stick around, however, Shuler plans to play again next year. Her celebrity is certainly extending beyond the '98 season -- on November 7 Shuler, along with Star Jones, Ysaye Barnwell, Mrs. Colin Powell, and others, was a "celebrity reader" a a Multi-Cultural Children's Book Festival at the Kennedy Center and will be Grand Marshal of the Bowman (S.C.) Christmas Parade on Thursday, December 10.
- **SNAPPED...** Furman senior Heidi White had a 26-game double-digit scoring streak snapped on December 1st, in a game against College of Charleston. White's scoring streak dated back to the Lady Paladins' December 20 game against East Tennessee State last year. Before the C of C game, North Carolina was the last team to hold White to single digit scoring. The good news is that White has still hit at least one three-pointer in the last 11 consecutive games.

NOTING THE LADY PALADINS

- •ON THE LINE... Furman's .889 winning percentage in Timmons Arena is on the line tonight. The Lady Paladins are 8-1 all-time in the new Furman facility.
- ON PACE... With a little luck and no injuries, Jackie Smith could become the third woman in Furman history to score more than 1,000 career points and claim 1,000 career rebounds. Only two former Lady Paladins Natalie Cleckley and Rushia Brown have joined both the 1,000-points and 1,000-rebounds clubs.
- **CLOSE TO 1,000...** Junior Jackie Smith is just 77 points away from the 1,000 mark. Smith scored 284 points as a freshman and 545 as a sophomore to tally 829 entering the 1998-99 season. If she follows her scoring pace of last season (18.8 ppg), Smith will reach the 1,000 points mark on either December 21 at Georgia Southern, or December 28 against Tulane. Smith also claims 494 career rebounds.
- •JUST ONE MORE... Junior Jackie Smith has tied the school record with 15 free throws in a game four times in her career. Prior to Smith's tenure the 15-free throw record was set by Jenny White in 1977. Current Furman coach Tonya Bristow tied the record in 1996 versus Western Carolina, but Smith has tied it on four occasions, including the Nov. 22nd game versus Middle Tennessee.
- •HOW ABOUT THE REBOUND RECORD... Since Smith has tied the school mark for points and free throws in a game, it's time for her to go for the rebound mark. Smith set her career high with 19 rebounds against East Tennessee State on January 31, 1998. The school mark for rebounds in a game is 23, however, and was set in January of 1991 by Natalie Cleckley.
- •EARLY SEASON WOES... Furman's 0-4 start this season seems even worse that it sounds because the Lady Paladins have lost by an average of 19.5 points per game. Fans can take heart, however, because Furman got off to an 0-6 start with an average 30.3 loss a season ago and rebounded to post a 16-13 overall record.
- **PRESEASON...** Furman's Lady Paladin team won both preseason exhibition games with point totals over 100. The Lady Paladins topped the Denmark National Team 101-55 and defeated the Low Country All Stars 105-72. Sophomore Amy King led Lady Paladin scoring in the preseason with 36 total points and an 18.0 per game average, while Jackie Smith averaged 15.5 points and a team-high 12.5 rebounds per game. Senior Heidi White averaged 17.0 points, while freshman Elizabeth Fleming led Furman from three point range with four-for-six (.667) shooting.
- •UP NEXT: Furman will host the 49ers of UNC Charlotte on Tuesday, December 8th, before going on the road for two games before the Christmas Holidays. The Lady Paladin game versus UNCC will be followed by a break for exams. Then, on December 17th, Furman plays at Wake Forest, followed by a game at Georgia Southern on December 21st.
- •**DOUBLE DUTY...** Furman junior Jackie Smith recorded 18 double-doubles last season. Her total broke the record for double-doubles in a season (14) set by Rushia Brown in

- 1993-94. In addition, Smith has 23 double-doubles for her career: the record of 48 is held by Rushia Brown.
- ON THE DOTTED LINE... Furman signed three players to National Letters of Intent in the early signing period.
- •Ashley Shipp, a 5-11 forward from Ft. Walton Beach, Florida averaged 18.9 points and 7.0 rebounds as a freshman at Okaloosa-Walton Community College last season... Named Honorable Mention All-America by Street and Smith... Three time All-State selection at Page High School.

Orion Wake, a 6-2 center from Woodbridge Senior High School in Woodbridge, Virginia... Listed in top 150 players in the nation and Honorable Mention All-America by *Street and Smith...* Named All-District and All-Region as a junior... Averaged 13.2 points and 10.4 rebound last season.

•Wendy Jones, a 5-6 point guard from Dutch Fork High School in Irmo, South Carolina... Averaged 21.0 points and 7.0 assists per game as a junior... Listed as top 50 player in *Hoops of the South...* Named all-area.


