Noting the Lady Paladins

- 2-28-98...** Furman's last meeting with Georgia Southern was on February 28, 1998, in the semifinal round of the Southern Conference Tournament. Haley Cook led the Lady Paladin effort that night with 18 points, while Amy King added 12 and Jackie Smith and Kena Hodges each scored eight. Telly Hall led the Eagles with 19 points, while Svetlana Trjeskal and Rosie Arnold each scored 12.
- LAST GAME...** Furman won its fourth consecutive game on Thursday, December 17, with a 72-59 victory over ACC-opponent Wake Forest. Junior Jackie Smith topped the 30-point mark for the sixth time in her career, with 31, and scored the 1,000th point of her Furman tenure. Heidi White was also in double-digits, with 13 points and tied Leitra Young for rebounding honors, with eight.
- 1,000 AND COUNTING...** Entering the December 17 game against Wake Forest junior forward/guard Jackie Smith needed 31 points to become the 12th woman in Furman history to score 1,000 in her career. Against the Demon Deacons Smith went 11-for-18 from the field, two-for-seven from three point range, and sank seven-of-eight free throws to score exactly 31 points. Smith, therefore, enters tonight's game with exactly 1,000 career points. Smith is also just 19 free throws away from tying FU's school record in that category, with 389. She currently totals 370.
- ONE FOR THE ROAD...** Furman's 72-59 victory over Wake Forest was the Lady Paladins' first road win this season and the first for the program since the Lady Paladins defeated Appalachian State on February 14, 1998.
- LEADING THE LEAGUE...** Furman junior Jackie Smith, the reigning Southern Conference Player of the Year, is again leading the league in scoring (20.0) and rebounding (8.0). In addition, Smith is ranked seventh in field goal percentage (.543), fourth in assists (3.71), 10th in steals (1.86), first in blocked shots (1.71), fifth in assist/turnover ratio (1.13), first in offensive rebounds (3.71), and seventh in defensive rebounds (4.29). In addition, Smith holds the Southern Conference season superlative for points in a game (37), free throws made (15), and rebounds (16), and is second on the 1998-99 superlatives list with a .750 field goal percentage (9-of-12) versus ETSU.
- GETTING A HANDLE...** In the first four games this season, the Lady Paladins averaged 22.5 turnovers in each, with a high of 30 against Wisconsin-Milwaukee. In the last two games, however, the Lady Paladins have averaged a more acceptable 15.5 turnovers with a season low of 13 versus Wake Forest.
- STREAK...** After starting the season 0-4, the Lady Paladins are riding a four game win streak into Hanner Fieldhouse tonight. Furman has beaten two SoCon foes, a Conference USA opponent, and an ACC rival over the last four games.
- CLOSING IN...** Furman senior Heidi White is currently 113 points away from reaching 1,000 in her career. If the senior continues at her current pace (11.9 ppg), she will break the 1,000 mark either at Chattanooga on January 18, or at home versus Georgia Southern on January 23rd. Either would be great. Though milestones are usually preferred at home, White is from the Chattanooga area and her mother is a police officer with the UTC public safety staff.

NOTING THE LADY PALADINS

•**WHAT'S YOUR LINE...** Furman junior Jackie Smith recorded a pretty impressive linescore against the Bucs of ETSU. Smith was 9-for-12 from the field, three-for-three from three point range, seven-for-seven from the line, and tallied 28 points, two assists, two blocks, and five rebounds. Amy King also responded with a career-high eight rebounds and a season-high 16 points.

•**TOUGH START...** Furman may have started the season 0-4, but all four opponents were in the NCAA's Big Dance a year ago. In addition, Clemson is currently ranked 14th by the Associated Press and 12th in the USA Today/ESPN Top 25, while Colorado State is rated ninth in AP and by USA Today.

•**A CAREER DAY...** Furman junior and current Southern Conference Player of the Year Jackie Smith tied the school record for points in a game versus Middle Tennessee State with 37. Smith was 10-for-16 overall, two-for-two from three point range, and 15-for-18 from the line. In addition, she claimed a team-high 16 rebounds for the 23rd double-double of her career.

•**HOME SWEET HOME...** Furman has posted a .909 winning percentage in Timmons Arena over the last year and a half, and is 3-0 at home so far this season. The Lady Paladins return to the friendly confines of Timmons January 5, for a 7 p.m. game versus UNC Greensboro.

•**BACK ON THE BENCH...** After spending the summer as a guard for the WNBA's Washington Mystics, Furman assistant coach Adrienne Shuler is back on the bench. Don't expect her to stick around, however, Shuler plans to play again next year. Her celebrity is certainly extending beyond the '98 season -- on November 7 Shuler, along with Star Jones, Ysaye Barnwell, Mrs. Colin Powell, and others, was a "celebrity reader" at a Multi-Cultural Children's Book Festival at the Kennedy Center and was the Grand Marshal of the Bowman (S.C.) Christmas Parade on Thursday, December 10.

•**ON PACE...** With a little luck and no injuries, Jackie Smith could become the third woman in Furman history to score more than 1,000 career points and claim 1,000 career rebounds. Only two former Lady Paladins - Natalie Cleckley and Rushia Brown - have joined both the 1,000-points and 1,000-rebounds clubs. Smith currently totals 543 career rebounds.

•**JUST ONE MORE...** Junior Jackie Smith has tied the school record with 15 free throws in a game four times in her career. Prior to Smith's tenure the 15-free throw record was set by Jenny White in 1977. Current Furman coach Tonya Bristow tied the record in 1996 versus Western Carolina, but Smith has tied it on four occasions, including the Nov. 22nd game versus Middle Tennessee.

•**HOW ABOUT THE REBOUND RECORD...** Since Smith has tied the school mark for points and free throws in a game, it's time for her to go for the rebound mark. Smith set her career high with 19 rebounds against East Tennessee State on January 31, 1998. The school mark for rebounds in a game is 23, however, and was set in January of 1991 by Natalie Cleckley.

•**UP NEXT:** Furman will travel to Tulane for the Green Wave's after Christmas Tournament, December 28-29. The Lady Paladins will face Tulane in the first round at 6:00 on December 28. The championship game is December 29 at 8:00 and other teams in the tournament include Middle Tennessee State and Maine.

•**DOUBLE DUTY...** Furman junior Jackie Smith recorded 18 double-doubles last season. Her total broke the record for double-doubles in a season (14) set by Rushia Brown in 1993-94. In addition, Smith has 23 double-doubles for her career: the record of 48 is held by Rushia Brown.

•**ON THE DOTTED LINE...** Furman signed three players to National Letters of Intent in the early signing period.

•**Ashley Shipp**, a 5-11 forward from Ft. Walton Beach, Florida averaged 18.9 points and 7.0 rebounds as a freshman at Okaloosa-Walton Community College last season... Named Honorable Mention All-America by Street and Smith... Three time All-State selection at Page High School.

•**Orion Wake**, a 6-2 center from Woodbridge Senior High School in Woodbridge, Virginia... Listed in top 150 players in the nation and Honorable Mention All-America by Street and Smith... Named All-District and All-Region as a junior... Averaged 13.2 points and 10.4 rebound last season.

•**Wendy Jones**, a 5-6 point guard from Dutch Fork High School in Irmo, South Carolina... Averaged 21.0 points and 7.0 assists per game as a junior... Listed as top 50 player in Hoops of the South... Named all-area.

•**MORE ON THE SERIES...** Furman has faced GSU 21 times. Here is a history of the series in which FU holds a 5-16 record.

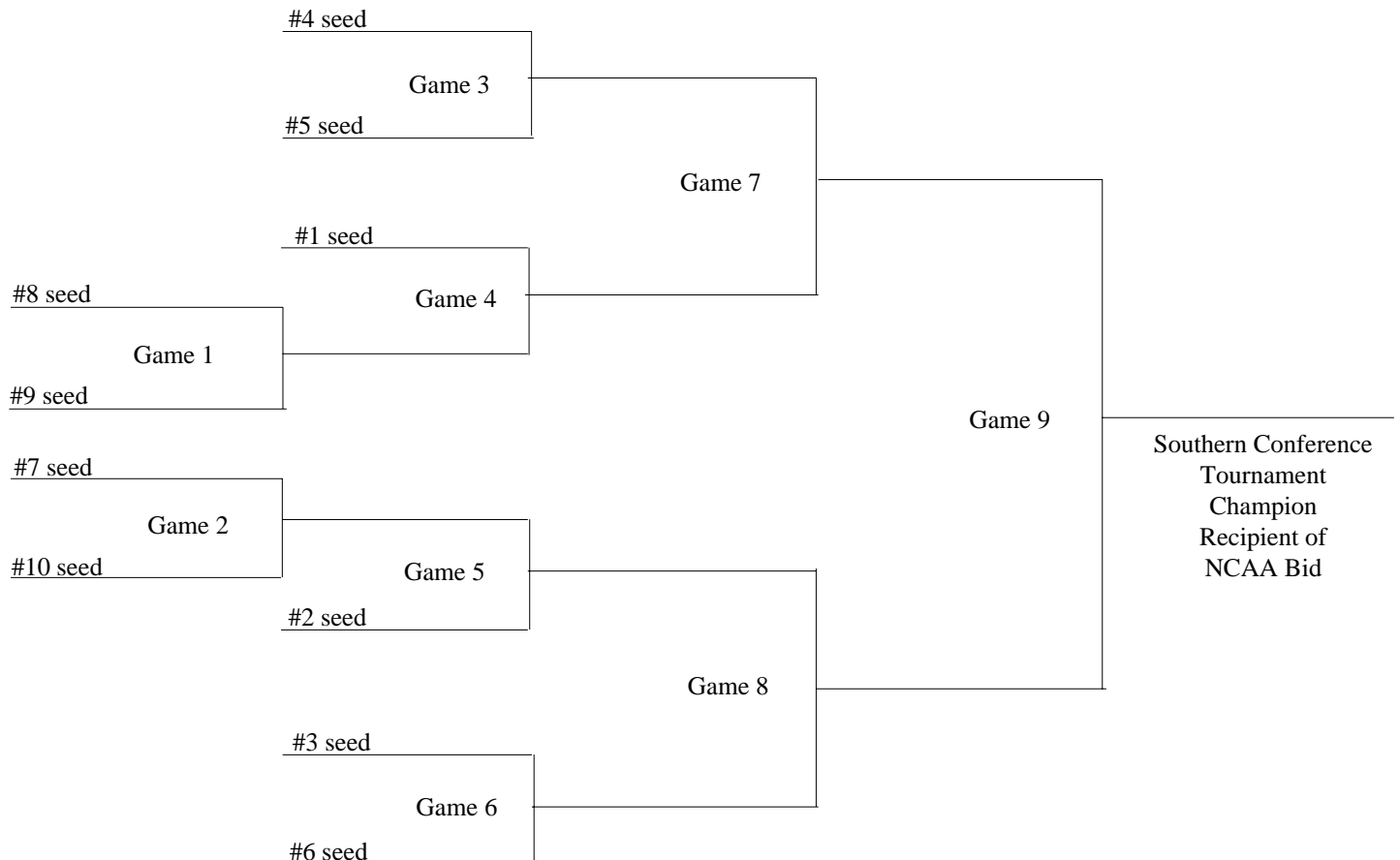
