Noting the Lady Paladins

• **LAST MEETNG...** The last meeting between these two teams was a triple-overtime barn-burner in the Physical Activities Center on Furman's campus. The Lady Paladins' Haley Cook tallied 26 points, while Natasha Jackson added 20 and Tonya Bristow totaled 21. Bristow also led the team with 11 rebounds. Current Lady Paladin Heidi White scored 12 points, while Jackie Smith added three with 10 rebounds. Furman led 35-32 at the half, but was outscored 31-28 in the second period for a 63 tie at the end of regulation. Both teams scored eight in the first OT and 11 in the second, but the Lady Paladins finally got the best of Raiders, topping them 13-4 in the third and final overtime for the 95-86 final score. MTSU was led by Jonelda Buck's 22 points and 15 rebounds. Seven players, four from MTSU and three from FU, fouled out of the game.

• **LAST GAME...** In the Lady Paladin season opener Clemson University defeated Furman 69-43. The Lady Paladins played well in the first half, shooting 42.9% in the first period before going a dreadful four-for-23 (17.4%) in the second half. The Lady Paladins were led by Jackie Smith and Heidi White, who each totaled 12 points. Smith also managed a team-high seven rebounds.

• **BACK AGAIN...** Furman returns two starters and six letterwinners from last year's team that went 16-13 overall and 11-5 in the Southern Conference. Furman's returning starters include Southern Conference Player of the Year (and preseason '98-'99 pick) Jackie Smith and senior Heidi White. Smith averaged 18.8 points and 10.4 rebounds a year ago to lead the Southern Conference in both categories, while Heidi White enters today's game with a 23-game double-digit scoring streak intact.

• **THE DISH...** Junior guard Heidi White recorded more assists in the 1997-98 season, than in her two previous years combined. White entered the 1997-98 season with 111 career assists, and dished off 112 last season to rank ninth on Furman's all-time list with 223.

• **ON PACE...** With a little luck and no injuries, Jackie Smith could become the third woman in Furman history to score more than 1,000 career points and claim 1,000 career rebounds. Only two former Lady Paladins - Natalie Cleckley and Rushia Brown - have joined both the 1,000-points and 1,000-rebounds clubs.

• **CLOSE TO 1,000...** Junior Jackie Smith is just 159 points away from the 1,000 mark. Smith scored 284 points as a freshman and 545 as a sophomore to tally 829 entering the 1998-99 season. If she follows her scoring pace of last season (18.8 ppg), Smith will reach the 1,000 points mark on either December 21 at Georgia Southern, or December 28 against Tulane.

NOTING THE LADY PALADINS

• **BACK ON THE BENCH...** After spending the summer as a guard for the WNBA's Washington Mystics, Furman assistant coach Adrienne Shuler is back on the bench. Don't expect her to stick around, however, Shuler plans to play again next year. Her celebrity is certainly extending beyond the '98 season -- on November 7 Shuler, along with Star Jones, Ysaye Barnwell, Mrs. Colin Powell, and others, was a "celebrity reader" at a Multi-Cultural Children's Book Festival at the Kennedy Center and will be Grand Marshal of the Bowman (S.C.) Christmas Parade on Thursday, December 10.

• **PRESEASON...** Furman's Lady Paladin team won both preseason exhibition games with point totals over 100. The Lady Paladins topped the Denmark National Team 101-55 and defeated the Low Country All Stars 105-72. Sophomore Amy King led Lady Paladin scoring in the preseason with 36 total points and an 18.0 per game average, while Jackie Smith averaged 15.5 points and a team-high 12.5 rebounds per game. Senior Heidi White averaged 17.0 points, while freshman Elizabeth Fleming led Furman from three point range with four-for-six (.667) shooting.

• **UP NEXT:** Up next for the Lady Paladins is a whole lot of travel. Furman plays at Middle Tennessee State on Sunday, November 22, and leaves for Colorado the following week for the Colorado State Rocky Mountain Invitational November 27-28. Furman doesn't open its home schedule until a December 1 game against the College of Charleston.

• **DOUBLE DUTY...** Furman junior Jackie Smith recorded 18 double-doubles last season. Her total broke the record for double-doubles in a season (14) set by Rushia Brown in 1993-94. In addition, Smith has 21 double-doubles for her career: the record of 48 is held by Rushia Brown.

• **ON THE DOTTED LINE...** Furman signed three players to National Letters of Intent in the early signing period.

• **Ashley Shipp**, a 5-11 forward from Ft. Walton Beach, Florida averaged 18.9 points and 7.0 rebounds as a freshman at Okaloosa-Walton Community College last season... Named Honorable Mention All-America by Street and Smith... Three time All-State selection at Page High School.

• **Orion Wake**, a 6-2 center from Woodbridge Senior High School in Woodbridge, Virginia... Listed in top 150 players in the nation and Honorable Mention All-America by *Street and Smith*... Named All-District and All-Region as a junior... Averaged 13.2 points and 10.4 rebound last season.

• **Wendy Jones**, a 5-6 point guard from Dutch Fork High School in Irmo, South Carolina... Averaged 21.0 points and 7.0 assists per game as a junior... Listed as top 50 player in *Hoops of the South*... Named all-area.

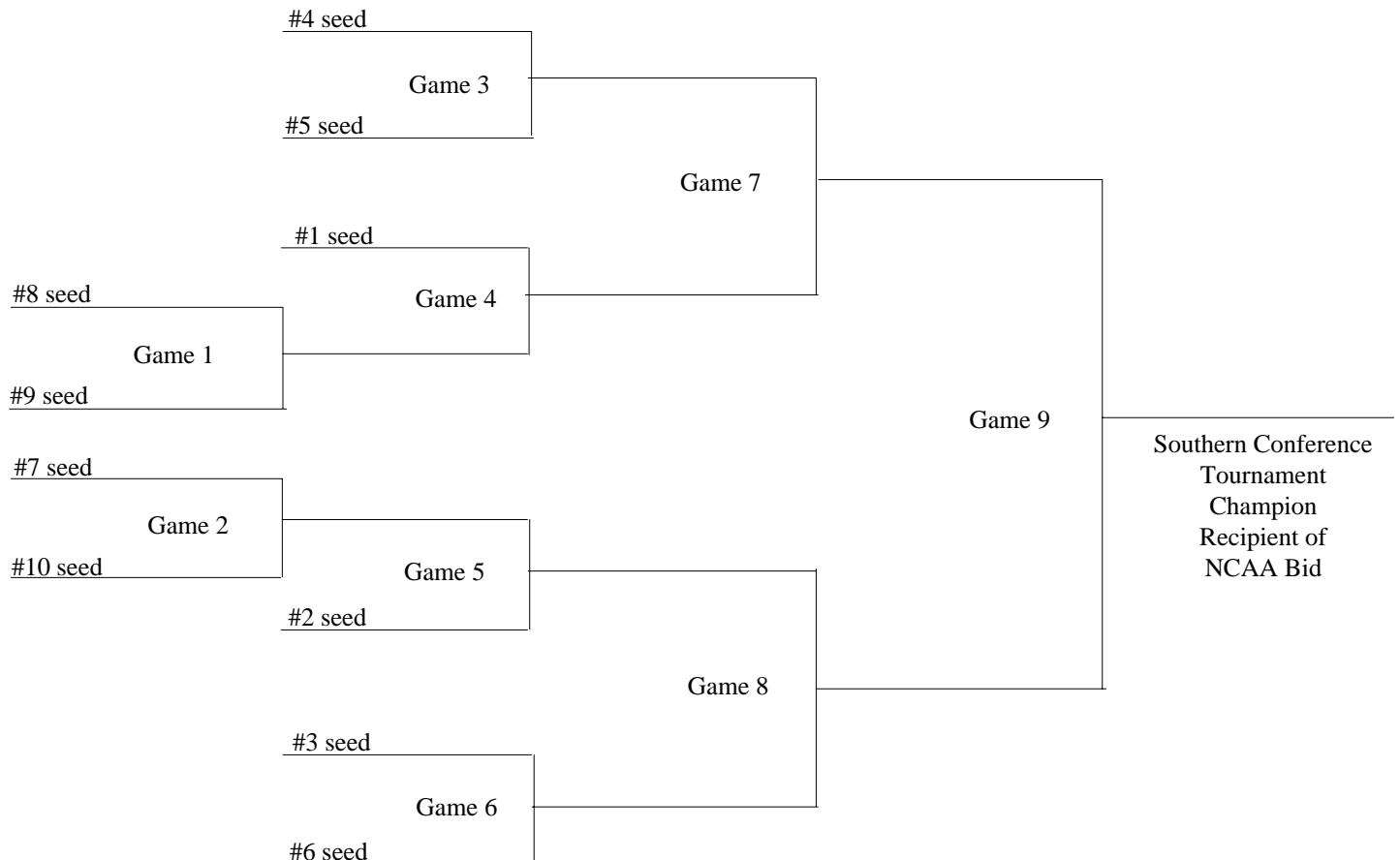
