Noting the Lady Paladins

- •11-30-96... The last time Furman and UNCC met was November 30, 1996, in Charlotte. The 49ers had four players in double-digits, but were defeated by the Lady Paladins 74-61. Furman's Heidi White led the Lady Paladin effort with 17 points, while Nate Jackson added 14 and Natasha Jackson poured in 13. Jackie Smith, a freshman at the time, scored five points and tallied four rebounds before fouling out with 5:41 left in the game. Furman shot 47.3% from the field, 33.3% from three point range, and 63.3% from the free throw line. Nikki Richardson scored a team-high 14 for the 49ers while Tamika Mackey added 13.
- •LAST GAME... Furman moved to 2-0 in the Southern Conference on Saturday, Dec. 5, with a 69-61 victory over East Tennessee State. Jackie Smith ruled the day with 28 points on 9-for-12 shooting from the field, a three-for-three day from three point range, and a seven-for-seven showing from the line. Amy King also poured in 16 points and claimed a team-high eight rebounds.
- •WHAT'S YOUR LINE... Furman junior Jackie Smith recorded a pretty impressive linescore against the Bucs of ETSU. Smith was 9-for-12 from the field, three-for-three from three point range, seven-for-seven from the line, and tallied 28 points, two assists, two blocks, and five rebounds. Amy King also responded with a career-high eight rebounds and a season-high 16 points.
- •TOUGH START... Furman may have started the season 0-4, but all four opponents were in the NCAA's Big Dance a year ago. In addition, Clemson is currently ranked 25th by the Associated Press and 24th in the USA Today/ESPN Top 25, while Colorado State is rated 12th in AP and 15th by USA Today.
- •GETTING A HANDLE... In the first four games this season, the Lady Paladins averaged 22.5 turnovers in each, with a high of 30 against Wisconsin-Milwaukee. In the last two games, however, the Lady Paladins have averaged a more acceptable 18.5 turnovers with a season low of 18 versus College of Charleston.
- **SNAPPED...** Furman senior Heidi White had a 26-game double-digit scoring streak snapped on December 1st, in a game against College of Charleston. White's scoring streak dated back to the Lady Paladins' December 20 game against East Tennessee State last year. Before the C of C game, North Carolina was the last team to hold White to single digit scoring. In addition, White had a 10-game three pointer streak broken against ETSU. Prior to the Bucs' game, White had hit at least one three pointer in 10 consecutive games.
- •CLOSING IN... Furman junior Jackie Smith is closing in on 1,000 points in her career. The guard/forward from Woodbridge, Virginia, is averaging 20.3 points per game this season and has already recorded two 20-plus showings and tied the school record for points in a game, with 37. Smith currently totals 951 career points and is just 49 away from this milestone. Smith will be the 12th woman in school history to score 1,000, and if she follows her scoring pace of last season (18.8) will reach 1,000 on either December 21 at Georgia Southern or December 28 versus Tulane. She also claims 529 career rebounds.

NOTING THE LADY PALADINS

- A CAREER DAY... Furman junior and current Southern Conference Player of the Year Jackie Smith tied the school record for points in a game versus Middle Tennessee State with 37. Smith was 10-for-16 overall, two-for-two from three point range, and 15-for-18 from the line. In addition, she claimed a team-high 16 rebounds for the 23rd double-double of her career.
- •ON THE LINE... Furman's .900 winning percentage in Timmons Arena is on the line tonight. The Lady Paladins are 9-1 all-time in the new Furman facility.
- BACK ON THE BENCH... After spending the summer as a guard for the WNBA's Washington Mystics, Furman assistant coach Adrienne Shuler is back on the bench. Don't expect her to stick around, however, Shuler plans to play again next year. Her celebrity is certainly extending beyond the '98 season -- on November 7 Shuler, along with Star Jones, Ysaye Barnwell, Mrs. Colin Powell, and others, was a "celebrity reader" a a Multi-Cultural Children's Book Festival at the Kennedy Center and will be Grand Marshal of the Bowman (S.C.) Christmas Parade on Thursday, December 10.
- ON PACE... With a little luck and no injuries, Jackie Smith could become the third woman in Furman history to score more than 1,000 career points and claim 1,000 career rebounds. Only two former Lady Paladins Natalie Cleckley and Rushia Brown have joined both the 1,000-points and 1,000-rebounds clubs.
- •JUST ONE MORE... Junior Jackie Smith has tied the school record with 15 free throws in a game four times in her career. Prior to Smith's tenure the 15-free throw record was set by Jenny White in 1977. Current Furman coach Tonya Bristow tied the record in 1996 versus Western Carolina, but Smith has tied it on four occasions, including the Nov. 22nd game versus Middle Tennessee.
- •HOW ABOUT THE REBOUND RECORD... Since Smith has tied the school mark for points and free throws in a game, it's time for her to go for the rebound mark. Smith set her career high with 19 rebounds against East Tennessee State on January 31, 1998. The school mark for rebounds in a game is 23, however, and was set in January of 1991 by Natalie Cleckley.
- •EARLY SEASON WOES... Furman's 0-4 start this season seems even worse than it sounds because the Lady Paladins have lost by an average of 19.5 points per game. Fans can take heart, however, because Furman got off to an 0-6 start with an average 30.3 loss a season ago and rebounded to post a 16-13 overall record.
- •UP NEXT: Furman will take a nine day break for exams before returning to action on Thursday, December 17, at Wake Forest. The Lady Paladins will then play at Georgia Southern on Monday, December 21.

- •DOUBLE DUTY... Furman junior Jackie Smith recorded 18 double-doubles last season. Her total broke the record for double-doubles in a season (14) set by Rushia Brown in 1993-94. In addition, Smith has 23 double-doubles for her career: the record of 48 is held by Rushia Brown.
- ON THE DOTTED LINE... Furman signed three players to National Letters of Intent in the early signing period.
- •Ashley Shipp, a 5-11 forward from Ft. Walton Beach, Florida averaged 18.9 points and 7.0 rebounds as a freshman at Okaloosa-Walton Community College last season... Named Honorable Mention All-America by Street and Smith... Three time All-State selection at Page High School.
- **Orion Wake**, a 6-2 center from Woodbridge Senior High School in Woodbridge, Virginia... Listed in top 150 players in the nation and Honorable Mention All-America by *Street and Smith...* Named All-District and All-Region as a junior... Averaged 13.2 points and 10.4 rebound last season.
- •Wendy Jones, a 5-6 point guard from Dutch Fork High School in Irmo, South Carolina... Averaged 21.0 points and 7.0 assists per game as a junior... Listed as top 50 player in *Hoops of the South...* Named all-area.


