Noting the Lady Paladins

•**BIG LOSS...** Furman lost point guard Tara Charles to a partial tear of the MCL in her left knee on Sunday, December 27, in New Orleans, La. Charles was averaging 6.3 points and 3.7 assists at the time of her injury.

•**LAST GAME...** Furman won an 83-66 decision over Middle Tennessee State in the Lady Paladins' second game of the season against the Blue Raiders. Back on November 22, MTSU handed Furman an 81-75 defeat in Murfreesboro. In the first game, Furman shot 38% from the field and 31% from three point range, but in the victory, the Lady Paladins shot 58.5% from the field, 37% from three point range, and 90% from the free throw line. Jackie Smith led the Lady Paladins with 28 points, while sophomore Amy King scored 20 for the first time this season. Kena Hodges topped rebounding with eight.

•**PLAYER OF THE WEEK...** Furman junior Jackie Smith was named Southern Conference Player of the Week on Tuesday, December 22nd, for the fifth time in her career. Smith averaged 28.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists, 1.0 steals, and 0.5 blocks for the week in wins over Wake Forest and Georgia Southern.

•**1,000 AND COUNTING...** Entering the December 17 game against Wake Forest junior forward/guard Jackie Smith needed 31 points to become the 12th woman in Furman history to score 1,000 in her career. Against the Demon Deacons Smith went 11-for-18 from the field, two-for-seven from three point range, and sank seven-of-eight free throws to score exactly 31 points. Smith enters today's game with 1,068 points. Smith also set the school record for career free throws against MTSU on December 29. Smith currently totals 391 made free throws, two more than the 389 tallied by Lauren Reed from 1981-85.

WE'RE DANCING NOW... Every loss the Lady Paladins have sustained so far this season was to a team that made the Big Dance last season. Finally, in the December 29 game against MTSU, the Lady Paladins defeated a tournament-team with an 83-66 rout of the Raiders, despite the loss of point guard Tara Charles to a knee injury on December 27.

•**STREAKIN...** Furman's season has been one of streaks. The Lady Paladins started the season 0-4, then rebounded with five victories in a row. The loss to Tulane snapped that streak, but Furman rebounded with a victory over MTSU. Furman hopes today is the beginning of another big win streak for the program.

NOTING THE LADY PALADINS

• **LEADING THE LEAGUE...** Furman junior Jackie Smith, the reigning Southern Conference Player of the Year, is again leading the league in scoring (21.7), rebounding (8.3), and offensive rebounds (4.09). In addition, Smith is ranked third in field goal percentage (.576) and blocks (1.27), fourth in assists (3.91), seventh in assist/turnover ration (1.13), and eighth in defensive rebounds (4.18) and free throw percentage (.804). Smith also leads the Furman team in scoring, rebounding, field goal percentage, three-point percentage, free throw percentage, and assists. She is also just one block behind Kena Hodges' team leading 15.

• **CLOSING IN...** Furman senior Heidi White is currently 78 points away from reaching 1,000 in her career. If the senior continues at her current pace (11.9 ppg), she will break the 1,000 mark either at Chattanooga on January 18, or at home versus Georgia Southern on January 23rd. Either would be great. Though milestones are usually preferred at home, White is from the Chattanooga area and her mother is a police officer with the UTC public safety staff.

• **TOUGH START...** Furman may have started the season 0-4, but all four opponents were in the NCAA's Big Dance a year ago. In addition, Clemson is currently ranked 14th by the Associated Press and 12th in the USA Today/ESPN Top 25, while Colorado State is rated ninth in AP and by USA Today.

• **SHE'S A DISH...** Senior Heidi White has been brilliant off the pass the last few games. In fact, White enters today's game having dished off five assists in each of the last four games and in five of the last six.

• **A CAREER DAY...** Furman junior and current Southern Conference Player of the Year Jackie Smith tied the school record for points in a game on November 22 versus Middle Tennessee State with 37. Smith was 10-for-16 overall, two-for-two from three point range, and 15-for-18 from the line. In addition, she claimed a team-high 16 rebounds for the 23rd double-double of her career.

• **HOME SWEET HOME...** Furman has posted a .909 winning percentage in Timmons Arena over the last year and a half, and is 3-0 at home so far this season. The Lady Paladins return to the friendly confines of Timmons January 5, for a 7 p.m. game versus UNC Greensboro.

• **BACK ON THE BENCH...** After spending the summer as a guard for the WNBA's Washington Mystics, Furman assistant coach Adrienne Shuler is back on the bench. Don't expect her to stick around, however, Shuler plans to play again next year. Her celebrity is certainly extending beyond the '98 season -- on November 7 Shuler, along with Star Jones, Ysaye Barnwell, Mrs. Colin Powell, and others, was a "celebrity reader" at a Multi-Cultural Children's Book Festival at the Kennedy Center and was the Grand Marshal of the Bowman (S.C.) Christmas Parade on Thursday, December 10.

• **ON PACE...** With a little luck and no injuries, Jackie Smith could become the third woman in Furman history to score more than 1,000 career points and claim 1,000 career rebounds. Only two former Lady Paladins - Natalie Cleckley and Rushia Brown - have joined both the 1,000-points and 1,000-rebounds clubs. Smith currently totals 571 career rebounds.

• **JUST ONE MORE...** Junior Jackie Smith has tied the school record with 15 free throws in a game four times in her career. Prior to Smith's tenure the 15-free throw record was set by Jenny White in 1977. Current Furman coach Tonya Bristow tied the record in 1996 versus Western Carolina, but Smith has tied it on four occasions, including the Nov. 22nd game versus Middle Tennessee.

• **HOW ABOUT THE REBOUND RECORD...** Since Smith has tied the school mark for points and free throws in a game, it's time for her to go for the rebound mark. Smith set her career high with 19 rebounds against East Tennessee State on January 31, 1998. The school mark for rebounds in a game is 23, however, and was set in January of 1991 by Natalie Cleckley.

• **UP NEXT:** Furman will host UNC Greensboro on Tuesday, January 5, in a 7 p.m. matchup. Good news for Furman, the Lady Paladins are currently 3-0 when playing on Tuesday.

• **DOUBLE DUTY...** Furman junior Jackie Smith recorded 18 double-doubles last season. Her total broke the record for double-doubles in a season (14) set by Rushia Brown in 1993-94. In addition, Smith has 24 double-doubles for her career (three so far this season): the record of 48 is held by Rushia Brown.

• **ON THE DOTTED LINE...** Furman signed three players to National Letters of Intent in the early signing period.

• **Ashley Shipp**, a 5-11 forward from Ft. Walton Beach, Florida averaged 18.9 points and 7.0 rebounds as a freshman at Okaloosa-Walton Community College last season... Named Honorable Mention All-America by Street and Smith... Three time All-State selection at Page High School.

Orion Wake, a 6-2 center from Woodbridge Senior High School in Woodbridge, Virginia... Listed in top 150 players in the nation and Honorable Mention All-America by *Street and Smith*... Named All-District and All-Region as a junior... Averaged 13.2 points and 10.4 rebound last season.

• **Wendy Jones**, a 5-6 point guard from Dutch Fork High School in Irmo, South Carolina... Averaged 21.0 points and 7.0 assists per game as a junior... Listed as top 50 player in *Hoops of the South*... Named all-area.

•**MORE ON THE SERIES...** Furman has faced WCU 33 times. Here is a history of the series in which FU holds a 21-12 advantage. Furman has won 12 of the last 13 meetings and is 13-1 at home versus the Catamounts, 7-8 in Cullowhee, and 1-3 at Neutral sites. Furman and Western played their first game February 19, 1971 in the Rock Hill Invitational. Furman's first win in Cullowhee came January 10, 1990, in a 53-41 decision. Furman's last loss in Cullowhee was a 75-66 decision on February 10, 1996.

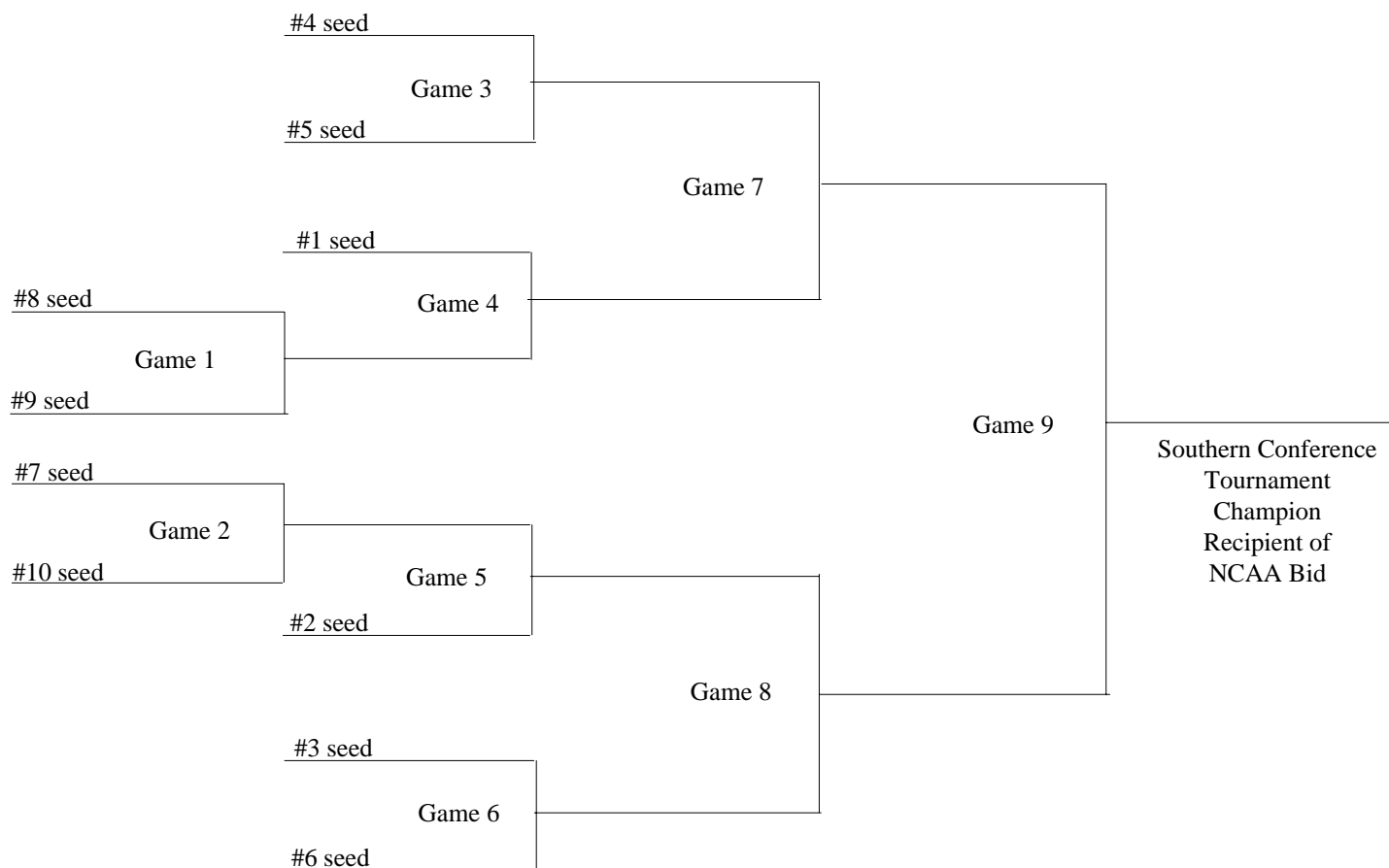
