THE GAME

Furman, ranked No. 4 in this week's Sports Network Poll following a 65-7 win over VMI on Saturday at Paladin Stadium, plays its first Southern Conference road game of the 2001 season when it travels to Cullowhee, N.C., to take on Western Carolina. The Catamounts are coming off a 20-6 road win over East Tennessee State on Saturday.

THE SERIES

Furman holds a 17-9-2 series advantage over Western Carolina, and the Paladins enter Saturday's game riding a three-game winning streak over the Catamounts, including a 38-14 triumph last year in Greenville. Two years ago, in the last meeting between the two schools in Cullowhee, the Paladins slid past Western Carolina 27-19. Furman has claimed wins in five of the past six clashes with Western Carolina, with the only loss, a 17-16 verdict, coming in Cullowhee during the 1997 season. In all games played in Cullohwee, Furman holds an 8-4-1 lead. In Greenville, the Paladins own a 9-5-1 record against the Catamounts.

FURMAN-WESTERN CAROLINA LAST MEETING

GREENVILLE (Sept. 30, 2000) -- Louis Ivory rushed for 187 yards and three touchdowns to lead nationally sixth-ranked Furman to a 38-14 win over Western Carolina.

lvory, who topped the 100-yard rushing mark for the eighth straight game, scored on runs of 65, 25, and 14 yards to highlight a Paladin attack that generated 518 yards in total offense.

Furman wasted little time in grabbing the lead. After stopping Western Carolina on its first possession, Ivory, on the Paladins' third play from scrimmage, took an option pitch from quarterback Justin Hill and raced 65 yards for a touchdown to give Furman a 7-0 advantage at the 11:54 mark.

Ivory, who topped the 100-yard mark on his third run of the game with a 39-yard burst up the middle midway through the first quarter, finished off Furman's second possession of the game with a 25-yard touchdown run to cap a five-play, 80-yard drive that put the Paladins ahead 14-0 with 4:55 left in the first period.

Furman extended its margin to 17-0 with a 24-yard Danny Marshall field goal before Western Carolina closed the margin to 17-7 on a 14-yard Fred Boateng touchdown run with 2:25 left in the half.

Furman polished off the Catamounts in the third quarter with a pair of touchdowns, the first on a 14-yard reverse run by flanker Bear Rinehart and the second on Ivory's third score of the game, also from 14 yards, to give the Paladins a 31-7 advantage.

Furman's ground attack accounted for 400 yards and featured nine ballcarriers, including an 80-yard rushing effort by Justin Hill. The win marked the Paladins' third straight over the Catamounts.

FURMAN LAST TIME OUT

GREENVILLE, S.C. (Sept. 22, 2001) -- Josh Cooper's 85-yard fumble return for a touchdown keyed a 24-point second quarter outburst and helped lead NCAA I-AA nationally fourth-ranked Furman to a 65-7 rout of VMI in the Southern Conference season opener for both teams.

The win, Furman's 20th straight over the Keydets, marked Furman's 100th victory in Paladin Stadium history, and the 65 points were the most since 1935 when the Furman defeated Piedmont 69-0. The triumph was also the Paladins' 10th consecutive home victory against Southern Conference opposition.

With Furman leading 14-0, Cooper, a senior free safety, picked up a fumble by VMI's Pedro Garcia at the Furman 15 and raced untouched 85 yards for the touchdown to put the Paladins ahead 21-0 at the 14:15 mark of the second quarter.

An interception by Furman's Rodney Johnson on VMI's next possession led to 26-yard field goal by Danny Marshall that extended the Paladin lead to 24-0

A blocked punt by Shelvis Smith at the Furman 43 led to the Paladins' next score. After quarterback Billy Napier connected on a 41-yard pass

to tight end Trent Sansbury to the Keydet 16, Louis Ivory ripped off a 13-yard run to the 3, and Napier completed the 3-play, 57-yard drive with a 3-yard touchdown run to make it 31-0 with 6:27 left in the half.

Furman capped its 24-point second period explosion with an 11-play, 69-yard drive that ended when backup tailback Toreico O'Neal scored on a 2-yard run of the last play of the first half to put the Paladins comfortably ahead. 38-0.

A 91-yard kickoff return by Furman's Brian Bratton to open the second half made it 45-0, and the Paladins later added a second kickoff return for a touchdown when Lamar Rembert bolted 79 yards following VMI's only score of the game to make it 58-7.

Furman, which outgained VMI 435-223, got 100 yards on 10 carries and a touchdown from All-America tailback Louis Ivory, who exited the game midway through the second period in favor of reserves. For Ivory, the 100-yard performance was his ninth straight and the 23rd of his career. Reserve tailback Hindley Brigham paced all Paladin rushers with eight carries for 106 yards and a touchdown.

NORE PALADIN STADIUM POINTERS...In beating VMI, Furman extended its home winning streak against Southern Conference opposition to 10 games dating back to the 1988 season and improved to 53-18-1 (.743) in Paladin Stadium against current Southern Conference member schools. Furman is 14-3 (.823) in its last 17 contests in Paladin Stadium.

VMI 65-7 on Saturday, Furman improved to 20-2 (.909) in Southern Conference season openers since 1980. Under head coach Bobby Johnson, Furman has now gone 7-1 (.875) in league inaugurals. VMI has been the victim in 11 of the Paladins' 20 conference season opening wins since 1980. Western Carolina, Furman's opponent this Saturday, is the only school to record wins over Furman in conference season inaugurals since 1980, having claimed victories over the Paladins in 1987 (20-14 in Cullowhee) and 1994 (35-24 in Greenville).

- ▼ TEAM NOTES FROM THE WIN OVER VMI...Furman's 65-7 pasting of VMI marked the 20th consecutive win over the Keydets, thus making it the longest series winning streak ever recorded by Furman over an opponent. The 65 points were the most scored by a Furman team since 1935 when the Hurricane (as Furman was then known) routed Piedmont 69-0. The 58-point margin of victory tied the existing Furman mark for most decisive Southern Conference victory — a standard first set only two years ago (1999) when Furman steamrolled VMI 58-0 in Greenville. In 10 games against VMI in Paladin Stadium, the Paladins have outscored the Keydets 437-96; in the last two meetings in Paladin Stadium, the differential is 123-7. In scoring 111 points in its last two games (65-7 vs. VMI, 46-7 vs. Elon), Furman matched the greatest two-game scoring total in school history first set in 1920 when W.L. Laval's Hurricane routed Oglethorpe (42-3) and Wofford (69-0) on the way to a 9-1 season. The win over VMI improved Furman's record against teams from Virginia to 28-2 (.933) since 1980.
- SPREADING IT AROUND...Furman's 65-point offensive explosion against VMI on Saturday featured nine touchdowns by nine different players. All six Paladin running backs who saw action in the game scored, although tailback Lamar Rembert (Ocala, Fla.) registered his on a 79-yard kickoff return. The other three touchdowns were registered by quarterback Billy Napier (Chatsworth, Ga.), who found the end zone following on a 3-yard run; Josh Cooper (Cincinnati, Ohio), who returned a fumble 85 yards for a touchdown; and Brian Bratton (Martinez, Ga.), who ran back a kickoff 91 yards to start the second half.
- ➤ SATURDAY SPECTATOR...Furman senior punter Lee Willis (Monticello, Ga.) was the only healthy regular who didn't see action in Saturday's 65-7 win over VMI. That's because Furman scored on 10 of its 14 possessions, had two possessions end on downs, turned the ball once, and ended the game in possession of the football. Actually, Willis came out on the field for one punt in the second half, but VMI was flagged for an offsides penalty, which gave the Paladins a first down. Saturday's game marked the first time since a 43-7 win over Presbyterian 1992 season that Furman did punt in a game.
- 7 victory over VMI on Saturday was the chance if afforded head coach Bobby Johnson to play every player in uniform except a half dozen redshirt candidates. Furman's starting offense was pulled after it scored with 6:27 to go in the second period and the Paladins up 31-0. The starting defense, meanwhile, played only the first half. Just how little some Paladin regulars played on Saturday is best reflected on the offensive line, where guards Marty Priore (Cincinnati, Ohio) and Trevor Kruger (Moultrie, Ga.) logged only 21 plays. Furman's other three starting offensive linemen - center Chris Stewart (Palm Harbor, Fla.) and tackles Donnie Littlejohn (Gaffney, S.C.) and Steven Cain (Anderson, S.C.), meanwhile, posted only 24 plays — all career lows. On defense, it was much the same. In the Paladin linebacking corps, for instance, starters Will Bouton (Greenville, S.C.), Sterling Frierson (Woodrow, S.C.), and John Thrift (Hartwell, Ga.) recorded only 30, 19, and 17 plays, respectively, in the contest.

- N RECORD BOOK ENTRIES ... When senior All-Southern Conference free safety Josh Cooper (Cincinnati, Ohio) returned a fumble 85 yards for a touchdown against VMI, it marked the third longest fumble return for a score in Furman history, trailing only the 94-yard return recorded by Kevin Quinlan in a 35-13 loss to North Carolina in 1980 and an 87-yard fumble return by Ray Zima in an 18-13 win over Marshall in 1936. The 91-yard kickoff return by Brian Bratton (Martinez, Ga.) and 79-yard kickoff return for a score by Lamar Rembert (Ocala, Fla.) on Saturday represented the first time in Furman football history the Paladins returned two kickoffs for touchdowns in a game. The nine PAT attempts by Danny Marshall (Atlanta, Ga.) against VMI tied the Furman standard for most PAT attempts by a player and team in a single game.
- ▶ BIG PLAY PALADINS ...In addition to returning a pair of kickoffs for scores and a fumble for a touchdown, the Paladins blocked two punts to set up scores in the win over VMI. Lamar Rembert (Ocala, Fla.) set the table for Furman's first score of the game when he stepped in front of a Keydet punt, which was returned by teammate James Thomas (Marianna, Fla.) 38 yards to the VMI 19. Shelvis Smith (College Park, Ga.) blocked a second Keydet punt, and three plays later the Paladins scored a touchdown to take a commanding 31-0 second quarter lead.
- MARSHALL ON THE MARK...In knocking down his only field goal try of the evening (26 yards) in the win over VMI, sophomore placekicker Danny Marshall (Atlanta, Ga.) has now converted his last nine field goal attempts, leaving him one shy of the Furman record for most consecutive made field goals set by Andrew Burr in 1991. Marshall, whose current streak includes made field goal tries in his last five attempts a year ago, has knocked down all four tries this year (including three in a 46-7 win over Elon on Sept. 8) and heads into this Saturday's game against Western Carolina game leading the Southern Conference in kick scoring with 27 points. As a freshman a year ago, he kicked three field goals in his collegiate debut to lift Furman to a 16-3 win over Elon and, in all, converted 14-of-18 field goals (.777) to finish second only to Chattanooga All-America kicker Matt Vick in kick scoring. He has now made good on 18-of-22 field goals (.818) and 62-of-64 PATs (.968) in his career.
- NOHNSON COMES UP BIG, AGAIN...Furman junior cornerback Rodney Johnson (Marion, N.C.), who sustained a season ending knee injury on an interception return only five plays into the 2000 season opener against Elon, recorded his second interception of the 2001 season on Saturday in the win over VMI, helping to set up a Paladin field goal in a 24-point second quarter. In the Paladins' 46-7 win over Elon on Sept. 8, Johnson totaled three tackles and one of the Paladins' four interceptions to spark Furman's defensive unit against the Phoenix.
- PALADIN POINTERS...True freshman fullback Eric Emerson (Newnan, Ga.) scored the first touchdown of his career on Saturday against VMI with a 2-yard run to give the Paladins a 14-0 first quarter lead. In rushing eight times for 106 yards and a touchdown against VMI, reserve tailback Hindley Brigham (Birmingham, Ala.) became the first Paladin running back since 1999 to rush for more yards than Louis Ivory. Prior to Brigham, the last Paladin running back to top Ivory in game rushing yardage was Stuart Rentz, who rolled up 144 yards (in relief of Ivory) in a 58-0 Paladin whitewash of VMI in Greenville. Last year quarterback Justin Hill ran for 115 yards (to Ivory's 44) in an 18-17 loss at Appalachian State. Brigham, who reeled off a 65-yard scoring run in his first carry as a Paladin in a 46-7 win over Elon on Sept. 8, is averaging 19.0 ypg on nine rushing attempts this year. Furman's defense racked up a season high three quarterback sacks against VMI. All-Southern Conference nose guard Ryan Spencer (Clover, S.C.) recorded the first sack of the game and, in limited action, totaled two tackles for losses of nine yards. Redshirt freshman Mike Killian (Atlanta, Ga.) earned his second straight start at defensive end and tallied three tackles and his first career sack. Thanks in large measure to its two kickoff returns for touchdowns against VMI, Furman is now averaging 38.3 yards per return (second in NCAA I-AA) on eight returns this year. All told, Furman and VMI combined to total 418 yards in kickoff returns in Saturday's game. VMI led the way with 250 return yards on nine attempts; Furman, meanwhile, had 168 yards but only on two returns, both of which went for touchdowns.

N JACKSON EYEING FUR INTERCEPTION MARK...Furman All-Southern Conference cornerback Richie Jackson (Cincinnati, Ohio) heads into Saturday's game against Western Carolina only three interceptions shy of the school career interceptions standard. Jackson, who recorded his 15th career pickoff in the Paladins' 46-7 win over Elon on Sept. 8, currently ranks third at Furman in career thefts with 15, trailing only Jerome Norris (1983-86, 18 interceptions) and Vince Perone, Jr., (1972-74, 16 interceptions).

▼ FU SPORTING BALANCED OFFENSIVE ATTACK IN 2001...Although only three games into the 2001 season, it's apparent Furman opponents are determined to slow down the Paladins' vaunted rushing attack this year following a 2000 campaign that produced a school season record 307.5 rushing yards per game highlighted, of course, by Walter Payton Award winning tailback Louis Ivory (Fort Valley, Ga.), who rushed for a Southern Conference season record 2,079 yards. Furman's first two opponents, Wyoming and Elon, keyed heavily on Ivory, helping limit him to 19 carries in each game. Due in part to Saturday's 65-7 rout of VMI — a game that saw the Paladin senior leave the contest midway through the second quarter after gaining 100 yards on 10 carries and with his team leading 31-0 — Ivory is averaging only 16 carries per game as compared to last year's roughly 27 attempts per game. Still, Ivory has managed to post three 100-yard performances and score four touchdowns this year while averaging an outstanding 7.5 yards per rush. Furman's answer to the opposition's stepped up attempt to slow down its lethal ground attack has been to turn to the air, where it has had good success. In the 46-7 win over Elon on Sept. 8, the Paladin offense, under the direction of junior quarterback Billy Napier (Chatsworth, Ga.) racked up 452 yards in impressively balanced fashion. It included 246 rushing yards and 206 passing yards. Napier, who completed 12-of-19 passes, including two touchdowns, accounted for 192 yards and did not throw an interception against the Phoenix. Although early scores helped limit Furman to only 10 pass attempts and 89 passing yards in the win over VMI, the Paladins head into Saturday's game against Western Carolina still averaging 154.7 yards per game. Last year the Paladins averaged only 115.3 yards per game through the air.

FINDING THE TIGHT END...If the work turned in by quarterback Billy Napier (Chatsworth, Ga.) and All-Southern Conference tight end Trent Sansbury (Lilburn, Ga.) in the first three games continues, it's a safe assumption that the Napier-directed Furman passing attack this fall will showcase the tight end. In the 46-7 win over Elon on Sept. 8, Napier hooked up with Sansbury on five passes for 86 yards and a touchdown, which covered 42 yards. Sansbury, who added a pair of catches for 52 yards in Saturday's 65-7 win over VMI, already has 11 catches for 160 yards and a touchdown this year after totaling only 14 receptions and two scores during the 2000 season. Ironically, five of his 14 receptions a year ago came in a 33-7 victory over The Citadel after Napier came off the bench in place of an injured Justin Hill.

N KEEP THAT FLAG IN YOUR POCKET...A year ago Furman

ranked as the league's least penalized team in the Southern Conference, picking up only 49 infractions for 422 yards during the regular season. Through three games this year the Paladins have only been flagged seven times for 77 yards.

- NOLDING ON TO THE PIGSKIN...In addition to ranking as the Southern Conference's least penalized team a year ago, Furman also paced the league in turnover margin (+1.09) for the second straight year. The Paladins head into the Western Carolina game sporting an even better turnover margin (+1.66) than a year ago.
- ▶ **BLOOD LINES**...Furman sophomore defensive end Brandon Poole is the son of former University of South Carolina Heisman Trophy winning running back George Rogers.
- KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY....Sophomore placekicker Danny Marshall (Atlanta, Ga.) is the son of former Paladin defensive end Tommy Marshall (1974-76), who later served as an assistant coach on the Furman staff for eight years (1986-93), during which time the Paladins captured three Southern Conference titles and the 1988 NCAA I-AA national championship. Redshirt freshman tight end Will Keller (Clayton, Ga.) is the nephew of Elliott Keller former Paladin fullback Elliott Keller (1962-63), who led the Southern Conference in rushing in 1962 with 724 yards. Freshman linebacker Andrew Carson (Newnan, Ga.) is the brother of Clemson All-America linebacker Chad Carson. Andrew's father, Tom Carson, played football at Georgia Tech, and his grandfather, Earle Carson, was a three-year letterman and end and honorable mention All-American at Furman (1928-30). A great uncle, M.A. Carson, was a twotime letterwinner as an offensive guard at Furman (1926-27), and another great uncle, Tom Carson, was an All-South offensive tackle selection and three-year letterman who served as captain of Furman's 1931 squad.
- ▼ THE PARKVIEW CONNECTION...Furman senior starting tight end Trent Sansbury and his backup, true freshman Willis Sudderth, are both products of Lilburn, Ga., and Parkview High School.
- NAME GAME...Furman junior wide receiver Bear Rinehart (Seneca, S.C.) is named to legendary Alabama head coach Paul "Bear" Bryant.
- **YOUNG FULLBACKS...**When true freshman **Eric Emerson** (**Newnan, Ga.**) started at fullback in the season opener against Wyoming, it marked quite a change from the experience the Paladins possessed at the position last year, when Derek Russell, a three-year starter who rushed for 1,187 yards and 37 touchdowns, occupied the post. Emerson's presence, along with those of redshirt freshmen **Corey Tant** (**Easley, S.C.**) and **AI Means** (**Charlotte, N.C.**), guarantee the Paladins will have a youthful fullback corps this fall.

▶ PALADIN OFFENSIVE LINE AMONG BEST IN NCAA I-

AA....Based on what Furman's offensive line helped the Paladins accomplish a year ago and the individual honors accorded virtually every member of the unit, the Paladin offensive front, which returns four of five starters, can rightfully be considered one of the best and most experienced in NCAA I-AA. The cast of four returning regulars -- all but one of whom are seniors -- includes a pair of All-Americans in center Chris Stewart (Palm Harbor, Fla.) and Marty Priore (Cincinnati, Ohio), and All-Southern Conference left tackle Donnie Littlejohn (Gaffney, S.C.). In addition, junior right guard Trevor Kruger (Moultrie, Ga.), who started every game a year ago, is back and has been tabbed a preseason all-conference pick by league head coaches. If also considering senior all-conference tight end Trent Sansbury (Lilburn, Ga.) with the offensive front, the Paladins sports five of their six starting linemen from the 2000 team and boast a combined total of 204 games played and 144 starts in their collective careers.

- RARE ACCOMPLISHMENT...When three Furman offensive linemen (OT Josh Moore, OG Marty Priore, and C Christ Stewart) earned first team All-Southern Conference honors a year ago, it marked the first time since 1990 and only the third time in school history (1981 being the other) that three Paladin offensive linemen had earned first team all-conference honors. With Priore and Stewart returning this fall, along with 2000 consensus second team all-conference tackle Donnie Littlejohn, Furman may yet grab three of the five first team all-league offensive line honors for a second consecutive season.
- MUSCLE MEN...Playing a key role in the strong work of Furman's offensive line is the unit's impressive physical strength as reflected in some of the numbers posted by unit members in team weight lifting tests. Leading the way for the third consecutive year is senior center Chris Stewart, Furman's strongest player. In spring testing, Stewart bench pressed 505 pounds, squatted 650 pounds, and power cleaned 347 pounds for a combined lift of 1,502 pounds in three exercises. Stewart's nearest competitor in the combined total was senior strong safety Shelvis Smith (1,288 pounds). Among Furman's other top performing offensive linemen in strength tests was junior tackle Steven Cain, who finished fourth on the team with a combined lift of 1,235 pounds: bench press (405 pounds), squat (500 pounds), and power clean (330 pounds). Senior guard Marty Priore, meanwhile, placed ninth with a total lift of 1,191 pounds, included in which was a squat of 590 pounds.
- ► FURMAN'S IVORY FEATURED IN SPORTS ILLUSTRATED, USATODAY...Furman senior consensus All-America tailback Louis Ivory (Fort Valley, Ga.) was featured in Sports Illustrated Magazine's August 13 College Football Preview issue. Ivory, the reigning Walter Payton Award winner, was profiled and quoted extensively in the magazine's two-page NCAA I-AA preview story. Furman's heralded running back was also featured in the August 13 edition of USA Today, as part of an extensive story on Furman's outlook for the 2001 season.
- N LOUIS IVORY: "THE IVORY TOWER"...Senior tailback Louis Ivory, a consensus All-America choice, reigning Southern Conference Offensive Player-of-the-Year, and NCAA I-AA football's Walter Payton Award recipient for the 2000 season, is nicknamed "The Ivory Tower", in part, because of his prodigious accomplishments last year. Ivory's nickname also works because the most notable landmark on Furman's campus is an ivory bell tower that overlooks the university's scenic 30-acre lake. The

tower, which first gained notoriety as an ivy covered landmark on Furman's old campus in downtown Greenville, has gained new fame thanks, in part, to Ivory. Ivory's complete biographical sketch, as detailed in this year's media guide and updated following his 10-carry, 100-yard performance against VMI on Sept. 22, is included below:

Buchanan Award recognizing the top defensive player in the NCAA I-AA football, led Furman with 134 tackles in 2000 and has now started in every game (38) of his Paladin career on the way to 395 tackles, good for eighth all-time at Furman. Thrift, meanwhile, has totaled 259 career stops in 38 games (29 starts) while demonstrating solid consistency. Bouton and Thrift are only the latest in an impressive line of outstanding Furman linebackers as evidenced by the school's 20 first team all-conference linebacker selections since 1975. N BOBBY JOHNSON: YEAR EIGHT...The 2001 football season marks Furman head coach Bobby Johnson's eighth year at the helm of the Paladin program and 24th season of service to the university. After suffering through a 3-8 inaugural season in 1994 (the program's first losing season since 1979), Furman rebounded in 1995 to finish 6-5. A year later, Johnson, a Columbia, S.C., native and 1973 Clemson graduate who starred as a defensive back for the Tigers, directed the Paladins to a 9-4 record and into the NCAA I-AA playoffs -- the program's first playoff appearance since 1990. Furman went 7-4 in 1997 and 5-6 in 1998 before bouncing back to go 9-3 in 1999 on the way to claiming the program's 10th league championship and second playoff appearance under Johnson. Included in the 1999 season was a 28-3 win over North Carolina. Last year Furman reeled off its second straight 9-3 season en route to another playoff appearance. Johnson's seven-year head coaching record is 50-34 (.595), and his last seven teams have combined to post a 47-26 mark (.644). Against NCAA I-AA competition over that span, Furman has gone 46-25 (.648). Johnson' 24-year tenure, which encompasses three stints (1976-80, 82-92, 94-present), includes work as defensive backs coach, assistant head coach, defensive coordinator, and head coach. The Paladins' record during that span is 182-87-7 (.672).

▼ JOHNSON EQUALS SUCCESS...Furman's 9-3 season a year ago matched the high water win mark for a Bobby Johnson-coached Paladin squad first set in 1996 when Furman went 9-4 and later matched in 1999 as part of the Paladins' 9-3 campaign. The nine regular season wins the last two years are the most by a Furman team since 1989 when the Paladins posted a 10-1 regular season mark on the way to a 12-2 record. Only 11 teams in Furman football history (95 seasons) have won at least nine games in a regular season, and Bobby Johnson has had a hand in eight of those squads (1980, '82, '83, '85, '88, '89, '99, and '00), including two as head coach.

N JOHNSON & JOHNSON (& JOHNSON)...It's ironic that of the nine Southern Conference football playing institutions, three schools have head coaches whose last name is Johnson: Furman's Bobby Johnson; Georgia Southern's Paul Johnson; and The Citadel's Ellis Johnson. In terms of coaching seniority in the league, Furman's Bobby Johnson, who took over the Paladin program in 1994, ranks first. Paul Johnson (1997) is next, and Ellis Johnson is third (2001).

▼ FOUR PALADIN FOOTBALL GREATS SELECTED TO FURMAN ATHLETIC HALL-OF-FAME...Former football standouts Tim Sorrells '81, Rock Hurst '86, Kevin Kendrick '91, and Hazel Gilstrap '43 were among seven honorees inducted into the Furman Athletic Hall-of-Fame in ceremonies prior to Furman's football game against VMI on Sept. 22

Also inducted were **Will Ertel '92** (baseball) and **Heather VandeBrake'96** (cross country/track & field), as well as **Dan Foster'49**, former sports editor and columnist with *The Greenville News-Piedmont*, who went in as an honorary member of the Furman Athletic Hall-of-Fame.

Sorrells, a four-year letterman and two-time All-Southern Conference selection as a quarterback, helped lead Furman to a pair of conference championships in 1980 and '81. A Greeneville, Tenn., product and two-time Paladin (MVP) Award recipient, he paced Furman to a 20-5-1 record as a starter and currently ranks fourth on Furman's career passing touchdowns chart (31) and 10th in passing yards with (2,945 yards). Furman's current offensive coordinator, he has served as an assistant coach at Furman since 1986, helping direct the Paladins to four league championships and the 1988 NCAA I-AA national title.

A two-sport standout in football and baseball, Hurst was named 1984-85 Southern Conference Athlete-of-the-Year. He served as co-captain and led Furman with 160 tackles in 1984 on the way to earning team MVP and AFCA/Kodak All-America honors as a linebacker. In four seasons of play, the Knoxville, Tenn., product helped the Paladins notch a 35-11-1 record and claim three league championships, and his 364 career tackles rank 11th on the school's career charts. In baseball, Hurst twice earned all-conference honors as a catcher, and he batted .382 with 12 home runs and 48 RBI his senior year. Ranked third on the Paladin career charts in home runs (31) and fourth in RBI (117), his .340 career batting average is the third best all-time at Furman, and his .616 career slugging percentage is still a school standard.

Kendrick served as a team co-captain and earned Southern Conference Defensive Player-of-the-Year and consensus All-America honors as a linebacker in 1990 after totaling a team high 179 tackles. A starter on Furman's 1988 NCAA I-AA championship team that posted a 13-2 record and led the nation in scoring defense (9.5 ppg), the Smyrna, Ga., native helped the Paladins to three straight league titles in 1988, '89, and '90 and a 41-12 mark during his career — the winningest four-year stretch in school history. His 574 career tackles ranks second all-time at Furman.

An Easley, S.C., product and three-year letterman as a tackle in 1939, '40, '41, Gilstrap played on Furman squads that posted wins over Georgia, North Carolina State, and South Carolina (twice), among others. A two-time honorable mention All-South Carolina selection and team MVP in 1941, he also played in the Carolinas Lions Bowl his senior year. A successful prep coach at Charleston's St. Andrews High School, where he went 108-48-7 and won two state championships, he later served as president of the Southern Conference, director of athletics at Appalachian State, and as a member of the NCAA Steering Committee.

✓ FURMAN AND THE NFL...Furman football currently sports three graduates on NFL rosters.

Tight end Luther Broughton '97 (Cainhoy, S.C.) is now in his second stint with the Carolina Panthers and fifth season overall in the NFL. A fifthround draft pick of the Philadelphia Eagles in 1997, Broughton spent the 1997 campaign with the Eagles before signing the Carolina Panthers, with whom he played the entire 1998 season before being traded back to the Eagles prior to the start of the 1999



campaign. After playing with the Eagles in 1999 and 2000, during which time he caught 38 passes for 399 yards and four touchdowns, he re-signed with the Panthers earlier this year. Linebacker **Orlando Ruff'99 (Winnsboro, S.C.)** is in his third season with the San Diego Chargers as a middle linebacker. In 2000 he started in 14 of 16 games for the Chargers and racked up 68 tackles, an interception, and five pass deflections. **John Keith '00 (Newnan, Ga.)**, a fourth round pick of the San Francisco 49ers in 2000, earned two starts at safety and totaled 18 tackles, a sack, and a interception before sustaining a broken arm in an overtime loss to the Oakland Raiders last year. Keith recently sustained a torn anterior cruciate ligament and is out for the entire 2001 season.

Former Paladin wide receiver **Des Kitchings '00**, a seventh round draft pick of the Kansas City Chiefs in 2000, was among the final players released by the New York Jets last week. Offensive tackle **Josh Moore '01** was released earlier by the Philadelphia Eagles.

LARAMIE, WY. -- Jarvis Wallum booted four field goals, including two in the second half, to lift the Wyoming Cowboys to a 20-14 season opening win over the visiting Furman Paladins in front of 14,167 fans at War Memorial Stadium.

In posting the victory, Wyoming, an NCAA I-A member of the Mountain West Conference, snapped an eight-game losing streak dating back to the 2000 season. The loss was the second for NCAA I-AA sixth-ranked Furman in its last three season openers.

Trailing 14-7 at halftime, Furman tied the score at 14-14 when tailback Louis Ivory, the reigning Walter Payton Award winner in NCAA I-AA, broke loose on a 44-yard touchdown run with 3:23 left in the third quarter. Wyoming, however, answered on its next possession by moving 75 yards in 10 plays to set up Wallum's third field goal of the game, from 22 yards out, to give the Cowboys a 17-14 advantage with less than a minute remaining in the third period.

Wallum added his fourth field goal, a 28-yarder with 10:00 to go in the contest, to stretch the Cowboys' lead to 20-14.

On the ensuing possession, Furman drove from its 35 to the Wyoming 7, where on a third and four play Paladin wide receiver Bear Rinehart was tackled for a three-yard loss on a reverse. Instead of kicking the field goal, Furman went for a touchdown, but quarterback Billy Napier's pass to a slanting and open Rinehart in the end zone was low and incomplete.

Taking over possession with 6:10 remaining, Wyoming ground up the game clock by moving 73 yards in 12 plays to the Furman 17, where Wallum missed a 34-yard field goal attempt with only 17 seconds left in the game.

The Cowboys, who racked up 87 offensive plays to Furman's 58, amassed 422 yards in offense in the contest and were paced by sophomore quarterback Casey Bramlet, who completed 30-of-48 passes for 331 yards. Bramlet, who scored Wyoming's lone touchdown of the game on a 1-yard run in the second quarter to give the Cowboys a 14-7 lead, connected with sophomore wide receiver Ryan McGuffey on 10 passes for 134 yards.

Furman was paced offensively by Ivory, who rushed 19 times for 136 yards and one touchdown. Furman netted 349 yards in offense, including 169 from quarterback Billy Napier, who completed 12-of-24 passes in the contest, but the Paladins suffered two turnovers, including a fumble at the Cowboy 38 and an interception that led to a Wyoming field goal. Bear Rinehart paced all Paladin receivers with four receptions for 97 yards.

GREENVILLE, S.C. -- Louis Ivory rushed for 126 yards and two touchdowns to lead the NCAA I-AA nationally sixth-ranked Furman Paladins to a 46-7 win over the visiting Elon Phoenix at Paladin Stadium.

lvory rushed 19 times and scored on runs of 2 and 8 yards while recording his eighth straight 100-yard performance and 22nd 100-yard outing of his career.

The win gave Furman (I-I) its 99th victory in Paladin Stadium since moving into the facility in 1981. It also marked the Paladins' second straight decision over Elon (0-2), which committed six turnovers.

Furman outgained Élon 452-180 and got a strong performance from junior quarterback Billy Napier, who connected on 12-of-19 passes for 192 yards and two touchdowns. Tight end Trent Sansbury led all Paladin receivers with five catches for 86 yards and a score.

Furman took advantage of a pair of Elon turnovers in the first quarter to race to a 21-0 lead.

An interception and 23-yard return by Shelvis Smith gave the Paladins the ball at Elon 19, and four plays later Napier hit Bear Rinehart on an 8-yard scoring strike to put Furman up 7-0 only three minutes into the game.

On its next possession, Furman moved 58 yards in nine plays to extend its lead to 14-0 following a 2-yard run by Ivory at the 4:53 mark.

A fumble recovery by Paladin defensive tackle LeBryan Sperling at the Elon 42 on the Phoenix's next possession set up another Furman score, which came on the next play when Napier connected with Sansbury on a 42-yard touchdown at the 1:53 juncture.

Elon trimmed Furman's lead to 21-7 with an 11-yard touchdown run by Martin Swindell with 10:38 left in the first half, but the Paladins answered with three Danny Marshall field goals covering 22,33, and 28 yards to extend the lead to 30-7 by halftime.

Furman upped its margin to 37-7 on its first possession of the second half with an 8-yard scoring run by Ivory before benching its first team offense and defense in favor of reserves.

Reserve tailback Hindley Brigham tallied the Paladins' last score on a 65-yard touchdown run on the first rushing attempt of his career.

GREENVILLE, S.C. -- Josh Cooper's 85-yard fumble return for a touchdown keyed a 24-point second quarter outburst and helped lead NCAA I-AA nationally fourth-ranked Furman to a 65-7 rout of VMI.

The win, Furman's 20th straight over the Keydets, marked Furman's 100th victory in Paladin Stadium history, and the 65 points were the most since 1935. The triumph was also the Paladins' 10th consecutive home victory against Southern Conference opposition.

With Furman leading 14-0, Cooper picked up a fumble by VMI's Pedro Garcia at the Furman 15 and raced untouched 85 yards for the touchdown to put the Paladins ahead 21-0 at the 14:15 mark of the second quarter.

An interception by Furman's Rodney Johnson on VMI's next possession led to 26-yard field goal by Danny Marshall that extended the lead to 24-0.

A blocked punt by Shelvis Smith at the Furman 43 led to the Paladins' next score. After quarterback Billy Napier connected on a 41-yard pass to tight end Trent Sansbury to the Keydet 16, Louis Ivory ripped off a 13-yard run to the 3, and Napier completed the 3-play, 57-yard drive with a 3-yard touchdown run to make it 31-0 with 6:27 left in the half.

Furman capped its 24-point second period explosion with an 11-play, 69-yard drive that ended when backup tailback Toreico O'Neal scored on a 2-yard run of the last play of the first half to make it 38-0

A 91-yard kickoff return by Brian Bratton to open the second half made it 45-0, and the Paladins later added a second kickoff return for a touchdown when Lamar Rembert bolted 79 yards following VMI's only score of the game to give Furman a 58-7 advantage.

Furman, which outgained VMI 435-223, got 100 yards on 10 carries and a touchdown from All-America tailback Louis Ivory, who exited the game midway through the second period in favor of reserves. For Ivory, the 100-yard performance was his ninth straight and the 23rd of his career. Reserve tailback Hindley Brigham paced all Paladin rushers with eight carries for 106 yards and a touchdown.
