Furman: Proven, hard-nosed runner who will help form one of the deepest corps of tailbacks in recent Furman history...expected to compete with veterans Toreico O'Neal and Lamar Rembert and redshirt freshman Brandon Mays for playing time in 2002, with starting job to be determined in preseason
