



# Furman Paladins (14-2, 8-0 SoCon) vs. East Tennessee State Bucs (3-8-1, 0-7 SoCon)



## FURMAN SOCCER GAME NOTES

The Furman women's soccer team is 14-2 overall, 8-0 in the Southern Conference and in sole possession of first place in the conference. Furman has already locked up the top seed at the SoCon Tournament and at least a share of the regular season title. A win tonight would give Furman, ranked 8th in the Southeast Region, it's first-ever perfect league finish and the outright 1999 Southern Conference championship.

Tonight is alumni night at Eugene Stone Stadium. Furman would like to welcome all varsity and club alumni to tonight's match.

On Wednesday, Furman shutout Appalachian State 3-0 as the Lady Paladins set school records for wins and shutouts in a season. Lindsey Facciolo, Katie Carson, and Melissa Turner each scored goals for Furman. Turner's goal was her 12th of the season, setting the single season record for goals.

This season, Turner has been named Southern Conference player-of-the-week twice, became the first women's soccer player at Furman to be named to the Soccer America Team-of-the-Week, and been named to the all-tournament team at all four tournaments that Furman participated in, including MVP honors at the Jacksonville/Legends Tournament.

Kaye Brownlee, who finished her freshman year second in the nation in assists per match, is currently leading the nation in assists per match this season. Brownlee has 14 assists in 16 matches. For her career, Brownlee has 33 assists in just 36 career matches.

Lindsey Facciolo, who earned a redshirt last season after sustaining an injury after three matches, has come on strong recently with goals in Furman's last two matches.

When senior Tara Brexel takes the field tonight, she will become the most experienced women's soccer player in Furman history. Tonight will be Brexel's 79th career match, more than any player in Furman's six year women's soccer history.

Entering the week, Furman had the eighth most potent offense in the nation with a 3.13 goals per match average. The Lady Paladins' winning percentage of .867 ranked seventh in the nation.

**Series Record:** Furman leads the all-time series with ETSU 2-0. Furman defeated ETSU 4-0 a year ago and 5-1 two seasons ago.

**Next Match:** Furman will travel to Georgia State for a match Tuesday at 4 p.m. and will host Iowa next Friday at 7 p.m. to close the regular season. Furman will host the first round of the Southern Conference tournament on Tuesday, November 2 at 7 p.m. Furman's likely opponent is either Appalachian State or Western Carolina.

**1999:** Started all 16 matches at defender for the Lady Paladins... Recorded 6 assists this season... One of the top defenders in the Southern Conference and the South Region... Selected to the all-tournament team at the Jacksonville/Legends Tournament.

**1998:** Started the first match of the season at midfield before moving permanently to defender... Had a stellar season at defender as she was named first team All-Southern Conference... Recorded one assist.

**High School:** Played club soccer for the Austin

Thunder... Served as captain for the Thunder and guided them to the South Texas state championship once and a runner-up finish twice, as well as a third place finish in the Miami Orange Bowl classic... A three year member of the South Texas ODP team and a three year regional camp qualifier... President of Pacesetters (a girls leadership organization), a National Honor Society member, a National Spanish Honor Society member, and a member of Mu Alpha Theta, a math honor society... Also served as assistant coach of the Under-11 Austin Thunder.
