

# Furman Lady Paladins (9-2, 3-0 SoCon) vs. Wofford Lady Terriers (8-4, 2-3 SoCon)



# **FURMAN SOCCER GAME NOTES**

The Furman women's soccer team, off to its best start in school history, is 9-2 on the season. Furman is ranked 8th in the Southeast Region in both the NSCAA and Soccer Buzz regional polls. Furman

South Carolina snapped a six match Lady Paladin winning streak last week with a 4-3 overtime victory in Columbia. Furman played well, but was unable to put South Carolina away in regulation, despite leads of 1-0, 2-1, and 3-2, before falling in overtime. Sarah Tollick, Erin Sims, and Nicole Malseed scored goals for Furman, while sophomore Kaye Brownlee recorded three assists.

Brownlee became Furman's all-time leader in assists in that match. She now has 27 career assists in her first 31 matches, surpassing current senior Melissa Sutton's 26 career assists.

Junior Sarah Tollick is currently Furman's second leading scorer with five goals and four assists. She has recorded a goal or an assist in eight of Furman's 11 matches this season.

Kaye Brownlee and Katie Carson both rank in the top twenty in the nation in assists per match. Brownlee has eight assists this season, placing her 9th in the nation, while Carson has seven assists, placing her 18th in the country. Furman has the 12th best winning

percentage in the country.

In Southern Conference statistics, Brownlee ranks fifth in points, fourth in goals, and second in assists. Katie Carson places third in assists, while Sarah Tollick is sixth in the conference in points.

Furman now turns it's attention to the Southern Conference race and its mission to claim the SoCon regular season title. The Lady Paladins' next six matches are all against Southern Conference

Series Record: Wofford leads the all-time series 3-2. Furman defeated the Terriers 3-2 last season in Spartanburg after jumping to a quick 3-0 lead.

**Next Match:** Furman will travel to Chattanooga, Tenn. on Friday for a 7 p.m. match with UTC. Furman's next home match is next Tuesday at 7 p.m. against Davidson.
